

We hope you can keep joining us for our Lenten theme of Cultivating & Letting Go on both Sundays and Wednesdays and then be a part of Holy Week, through Maundy Thursday as we celebrate First Communion with our fifth graders, Good Friday with an intergenerational service, and then Easter Morning with 8:30 and 10:30 worship. Palm Sunday is a Festival Sunday in the Christian Church marking the beginning of Holy Week. Many were drawn into the biblical story of Holy Week. # Health Ministry

*I am so excited!* April brings not only showers but some of my favorite programs. The **Matter of Balance class will start April 2nd** on Tuesdays for 8 weeks. This class looks at reasons folks fall and ways to minimize the risk. The class is free because of a grant through Crow Wing Energized and open to the community — if you know of someone who might benefit, please let them know. April will also

be the start of our Lifestyle Change — Diabetes Prevention Course which will also be held Tuesdays. (See posters for sign-up information for both classes.) The course that I led last year has just finished the year journey through changing how we look at food and ways to eat in a more healthy way and I was so proud of the long-term losses that folks were able to maintain.

See me if you have questions about either course.

April will also see the start of a new **Caregiver Support Group** that will meet once per month. I will be facilitating the sessions and each month we will look at topics of interest to those who care for folks with health issues. This will also be open to the community. As we care for others, it is important to focus on our own mind, body, and spirit health and find others who share that journey. During times of trouble, it is so helpful to talk to others who have similar feelings and may have found ways to deal with issues that come up. We will also have sessions related to certain disease entities such as memory loss and end-of-life issues in order to gain knowledge about what our loved ones are going through. There is no need to sign up, just watch for posters with date and time.

I hope that you have April 27th on your calendar already—it is the date of our first **Power of Aging Expo** which is being planned by Crosslake Cares — a non-profit group composed of area churches and community leaders. Mark Rosen is the keynote speaker and there is something for everyone on that day including exhibits, raffles, free

food, and mini-sessions. This free event is being held at the Log Church and I will be presenting one of the mini sessions with Steve Kappes, our local pharmacist. The Expo will be held yearly and is geared to everyone. Watch for posters, bulletin inserts, and announcements on radio and press. It has been great to work with so many talented folks from the community especially

members of area churches. It could be a gateway for other shared activities and events as we seek not to duplicate efforts.

Work is ongoing for our annual **Memorial Day Observance**. Our first organizational meeting will be held April 16th at 2:00pm. Anyone who is interested is welcome to be a part of our planning group. I hope to have a speaker confirmed soon (although it will be hard to top Dr. Lokstad, our last year's presenter). Our service will continue to feature music, calling of the veterans, and the wonderful flyover, I am already starting prayers for perfect weather -) please see me if you have ideas as to how to make the day even more special.

# Sharing God's Bounty

#### What's Your Gift?

Perhaps you haven't spent much time, if any, pondering that question. God has given each of us at least one gift, though, and if even one of us does not use that gift, the Body of Christ suffers. Paul, in Ephesians 4:16 writes, *"From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and build itself up in love, as each part does its work."* 

Christian stewards tend to have a lower

opinion of themselves than they ought, denigrating their abilities and talents and even their financial capabilities. When we keep in mind that it is God himself who has chosen our gifts and blessed us materially, we

realize that to belittle these gifts is to question

God's wisdom and generosity. Again we read Paul's words, now from Romans 12:5, "... in Christ, we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others." He goes on to say that whatever our gifts are, we are to use them as effectively as we can.

Yes, it is the pastor's job to preach the Word and administer the Sacraments, but we, as stewards who have received the Great Commission from Matthew 28:19–20, are to be obedient also to Jesus' command to tell the Good News to the whole world. Yes, there are those in your parish who seem to have more abilities and talents than you, and there may be members who have more money than you... perhaps may even be very wealthy. Does that exempt you from the responsibility to serve or to give? By no means! In 2 Corinthians 9:7 we're commanded, *"Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."* Each one is to give and to give cheerfully... of their time, talents,

> and treasures. God looks at the size of the heart of the giver rather than at the size of his gift. *"For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what he does not have"* (2 Corinthians 8:12). If you are not using

your gifts, if you are not giving your money, if you are not sharing your time, the Body of Christ suffers. We need each other and our individual gifts in order that we might carry out our responsibilities as stewards to the end that the name of Christ might be made known.

Monetary gifts to God teach us patience and prudence. We learn how to control our inordinate wishing for many things that we buy. This discipline of our will makes it easier for us to live God's law. Therefore giving definitely helps us to do God's will.


We are thrilled to announce two scholarship opportunities available to students of our church! Applications are available online until April 30.

Deuteronomy 15: 10. (NIV)


#### Part II


