This includes the election of the Presiding Bishop and Secretary as well as persons to the Church Council and to churchwide boards and committees. Please keep this process in your prayers!



Any place without a large span of ceiling and without windows is recommended- much improved over the storm cellar that we as kids used to go into (never knew what was down there in the dark and creepy

place under our old farm house. Some folks are not familiar with a great ministry that is available at Crosslake Lutheran. Because of a generous memorial gift from one of our members, the Angel **Food Program** has been up and running for the past several years. The funds from this donation go toward preparing food for those in need especially after illness, bereavement or hospital stays. We have been blessed to have folks like Herb and Lori Nelson be a part of the Care and Share café which donates any extra food toward our program in exchange

for a yearly donation to their program. We also have prepared food as a group in our church kitchen so that the freezer is always stocked with single and family meals to reheat. Our next group cooking session is going to held from 12:30-3pm on **August 13th**. All food to prepare is purchased prior and all you need to do is show up and be assigned to one of the stations that has a food to be prepared. There is a signup sheet on the hallway bulletin board and I will be personally calling those of you who have expressed an interest in being part of the team. It is a great way to serve others and for those who are super busy, a great one time and done service ministry. If you have a great idea as to what meals to cook, I am open to suggestions- it should be freezer friendly and could include baked goods as well. There is nothing like a gift of food that says you are part of our fellowship family and I know that Marlys is looking down from heaven knowing that her final

gift is being put to good use. If you have questions, please see me.

The **Final gift workshop** signup is available to register you for that great day of information on **August 15th**. We will be making this session open to the community so that the information can hit a bigger audience so don't wait to signup since there is a limit as to how many we can accommodate. If you have already done your final preparations for the next part of your life's journey towards home, please review your documents yearly since things do change as circumstances change- be sure that updated copies of advanced directives are with your provider so that they can be implemented if you cannot speak for

yourself.

Heart and Soul preparations are in full swing. Dr. Eric Fenstad from Minneapolis Heart will again be our speaker for a talk titled "Women are from Venus, diagnosis and treatment of heart disease in women" it will include ways that heart attacks and other diseases present in women and the newest advances that are making a huge difference in treatment. I will present the second half of the evening " Some of my best memories are about things that never

happened" a discussion about memory, how it works, what interferes with producing memories and how memories can both help and hinder our life journey. I work with a lot of folks who struggle with memory issues including my own father- it can be so difficult to diagnose, treat and accommodate for memory loss but there is hope despite the diagnosis of memory loss. The Heart and Soul night is open to the community and is due in part to our wonderful partnership with Minneapolis Heart Institute - Brainerd and Crosby offices which I am grateful to be a part of. Invite your neighbors to the **September 17th evening which starts at 6pm.**

Much of my time is spent finding resources for church members who are hoping to stay in their homes after illness and injury. There are gaps in our services in the city of Crosslake including meal delivery, transportation, and other ways to keep (continued on next page)

August Bible Study

Joseph. Is it just a story about a coat? Is Joseph a hero? Or is it deeper than that? Let's have a peek and find out. The Joseph saga is the longest continuous story in the Bible! It starts in chapter 37 of Genesis and runs all the way through chapter 50. With so much space given to tell the story it seems we should spend some time uncovering what we might find out about ourselves and about God through this story. Our choir is going to help us. We will be worshiping with selections from "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat" musical on August 11th at the 8:30am indoor worship, and August 18th at the 10:00am outdoor worship. To come alongside the musical we want to offer a brief look into the story through two Bible study sessions offered on Wednesdays from 10:00 to 11:30. It you want to pre-read the story before the sessions, that is great, but you can just show up and we will move through the story together. Here is how we will proceed:

Wednesday August 7th we will look at selections from Genesis 37-41 as Joseph was brought from <u>high to low</u> with some help from his own pride and some jealous brothers.

Wednesday August 14th we will look at selections from Genesis 42-50 as Joseph was brought from low to high due to some good dream interpretation and smart grain management.

What we might find in this significant story is that <u>dysfunctional relationships</u> <u>abound and God keeps persevering</u>, tending, feeding, and caring in spite of it all. I don't know about ya'll, but I find this is Good News...Great News really, because as another one of God's human critters, I have been known to be a little dysfunctional too.

Sharing God's Bounty

The Importance of Giving

It is not uncommon for church members to perceive in a negative way the encouragement from their church to give generously. The perception of some people is that the church is only interested in their money.

Certainly, a generous giving congregation does provide the money needed by the church for its budget so the church should

work hard to help people grow in their giving. However, Scripture indicates that giving is as much for the sake of the giver as it is to support the needs of the church. Pastors and church leaders understand that giving is an activity that God directs us to do. Jesus said, "Freely you have received, freely give" (Matthew 10:8). Paul wrote to the Church in Corinth about the collection for God's people, "On the first day of every week, each one of you

should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income. . ." (1 Corinthians 16:2).

Giving blesses the both the giver and the recipient of the giving. The blessings to the recipients are obvious. Not as obvious but as important to understand is that giving enriches the life of the giver. Giving strengthens the relationship that we have with our Lord. Through our giving, we are reminded of God's ownership and how dependent we are on him. Giving demonstrates our faith and trust. We give as part of our worship. Giving allows us to be used by God in partnership with him.

In God's Word, we are told that those who give faithfully and generously will receive even more of God's blessings. In Proverbs 3:9 we read these encouraging words, "Honor the

Lord with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing . . ." God blesses all people, but he wants to bless us even more for our faithful giving. "One man give freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty" (Proverbs 11:24). Generosity is the path to blessing. By contrast, a stingy person doesn't make any friends and hurts

himself in the long run. Through the prophet Malachi, we are told again how God will bless us for our faithful giving, "'Bring the whole tithe in the storehouse that there may be food in my house. Test me in this,' says the Lord almighty, 'and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much

blessing that you will not have enough room for it' " (Malachi 3:10).

In the future, we need to thank church leaders who encourage us to grow in our giving. Through our giving, we are expressing thanks to God for his goodness to us. We are also helping to extend God's kingdom through our church, providing for the needy, and enriching our own lives. As we grow spiritually and receive more of God's blessings, we will better understand and respond to the encouragement to increase our giving.


