

LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE FOR MIDDLE EAST CRISIS

Due to escalating conflict in Gaza and Israel, a severe humanitarian crisis is rapidly unfolding in the Holy Land. The ELCA has a longstanding relationship with partners in the region, including the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and Augusta Victoria Hospital. Lutheran Disaster Response has a history of providing support for our partners and will be prepared to answer calls for assistance when the time comes. Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton has issued a letter of solidarity to Bishop Dr. Sani-Ibrahim Azar of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land. In it, she writes, "I encourage the people of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America to unite in prayer for the families of innocent civilians whose lives were lost, as well as pray for healing for all the injured, fearful and traumatized. I pledge our accompaniment and support to you as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and otherwise) to those affected by this war.""

Gifts to Lutheran Disaster Response equip us to respond to this and other disasters, whenever and wherever they strike. Gifts designated for "Middle East Crisis" will be restricted to and used in full (100%) for those affected by disasters in the region. HEALTH MINISTRY

What a glorious fall! I wish that I had the same colors on my watercolor palette tray. It was so vibrant despite the dry season - it seemed that the yellows just glowed. It is certainly time to do the fall things with expected white stuff coming; a good time also to clear out old medications, check your CO detectors and fire extinguishers and clear out the dryer vents. I will be heading south to my winter home soon but am always available by phone so please do not hesitate to call using my cell phone number which is in the directory. I really use the online one as it is so convenient to have it no matter where I am for those phone calls to check on someone or to just say hi. You can always reach out to the church office if you need other types of help including food, visits and letting your church family know about concerns for prayers or pastoral care. It is also a time to think about reaching out to neighbors that are living by themselves, especially when so many folks take off for the winter. It is a fine line

between getting into someone's business versus being helpful and neighborly but I am sure you will be able to walk that line. Please let me know if there are folks that you are worried about since there may already be a process in place that you may not be aware of.

Thank you to all who attended the 8 week Matter of Balance class. We had more than 12 participants from our church and the community attending this very valuable class that improves strength and balance which are key to preventing falls. We also talked about how to decide which activities should be considered high risk and how to reduce the risk of falling and injury. Great job everyone!

Thank you to all who attended the two Dementia sessions this past month. Kent O' Grady and Eleanor Burkett did a fine job of reviewing the basics of dementia, especially Alzheimer's, which is the most common type of memory loss. With the two sessions, there were over 100 attendees from our church family and the community at large. The Dementia Friend and Champion session provided training for a core group of church and community members who will be providing dementia information to a larger audience including businesses and other public gathering areas. The goal is to create a dementia-friendly community that supports those with memory loss so that they feel accepted and included. It is so interesting that memory loss is like mental health issues in terms of feeling like it is something that is hidden or not talked about unlike other health issues. Our goal is provide education for both those dealing with memory loss and also for those caring for or encountering those individuals. Stay tuned for further programs in the spring as we kick this program off with partnerships with the Log and Catholic church.

Another program that is coming up is the All Saints observance where we will be remembering those who have passed not only in this past year but in perhaps in years past. Loss and grief has no timeline in terms of when it is completed and the two services (one on Sunday, November 5 and Wednesday, November 1) will include a time to light candles and remember those are in their heavenly home. For those who are looking for ways to connect with others, there are many ways to find those connections through the many programs that are available at the church. Diners Group, the Wild Ones, Knit Wits, Jul Fest, Choir, Book Club and so many other gatherings are perfect ways to make new friendships especially if you are new to area. Another thing to think about is having a Thanksgiving get together for those who do not have family coming for the holiday. My home church in Barnesville still has a community-wide dinner for everyone that includes all the fixings which is so appreciated by all. I will be cooking my turkey on a grill on South Padre Island but will think of all of you. I even make lefse and take it to all my Texan neighbors but it really needed to be explained about needing to add sugar and butter before eating. I pray that you will find the holiday season full of food, friendships and time with family both regular and church. Please reach out if you need anything, I am just a call away.
