December Greetings & Merry Christmas!


It feels fitting to write "Merry Christmas" on the first big snowfall of the season that has already started on November 15th! The strange thing is that it's tiny little bits of nearly invisible snow falling over a very long span of time, several days now. (If you're a snowbird reading this not in MN, you can just smile!) When you look outside currently, it hardly looks like it's even snowing, but it IS piling up! There's quite a few inches now that

need to be shoveled, plowed, and it's making the streets slippery and slick! This almost invisible snowfall leading to quite an accumulation got me thinking about God's love and our theme for Advent and Christmas.

This month, we are going to sing and listen to the hymn "Come Thou Long Expected Jesus" as we wait and watch again for the birth of Christ and Christ's second coming. And one hymn tune that we are going to sing those words to is "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling." It's powerful to combine these two hymns of our long-expected Jesus "born a child and yet a king" and "joy of heav'n to earth come down" as Christ enters "every trembling heart" at Christmas and every time we join together in Holy Communion. The power of Christ's love that enters our hearts sometimes comes almost as invisibly and persistently as the tiny snowflakes falling all around. We don't notice the perseverance and power of it until we stop, look around, and then realize it has accumulated quite abundantly in all the relationships, actions, and wonderment around us — which is often so much what Christmas is about. God's love made manifest through people — gatherings, celebrations, and togetherness. And yet, it can be a hard time as well, for so many reasons, for those not able to be in community as they would like to be. Christmas can also be difficult! That's also why I appreciate the short prayer embedded in our theme hymn, "let us find our rest in thee."

We hope that you can find both rest and community in Christ, God's Love Made Manifest for the whole world, as we gather together for worship and service this Advent and Christmas experiencing God's love accumulating in our lives. Be sure to mark our 2nd Annual Celebrating Christmas Together with dinner and a "pop up" Christmas program for all ages on your calendar for Wednesday, December 14th! And note

that on Christmas Day, we'll have a 9:30 worship with lessons and carols, wearing our Christmas comfy & cozy clothes. Bring your coffee mug and a treat to enjoy during the service as if we are gathered together on Christmas morning in the living room!



HEALTH MINISTRY



Blessings during this season of anticipation of the birth of the Christ Child. I love looking forward to things, it is part of the wonder and magic of Christmas. What do you have to look forward to during this season of Advent? For some people who have experienced loss of their loved one or experienced other loss such as having to move from their home into assisted living, this can be a time of sadness and a multitude of many other emotions other than excitement and wonder. I know that many of you minister in so many ways to those experiencing loss, but please be even more intentional and sensitive

to their perspective. Inviting them into your circles, sending a card, giving a hug, asking how they are really doing can reflect God's love made real in every day life. It is also a season when checking on neighbors during snow, cold and other winter challenges can make a huge difference in helping others feel less isolated and lonely. I will be in my winter home but will still be checking in with folks by phone and have wonderful folks who will continue the local work until I return. Please do not hesitate to reach out to me if you have concerns about someone or have concerns yourself.

Many of you will be traveling at some point this month or early January and I found a resource to protect your health when traveling. Some suggestions include: 1. Stretch every hour for a few minutes even in the car to avoid fatiguing muscles in the back and neck. 2. Make sure that your head is kept level over your pelvis and that your neck is not stretching forward. 3. Place a pillow behind the small of your back or a neck support if you think you may fall asleep. 4. Use heat packs or heated seat to keep muscles from getting cold and tight. 4. Be careful lifting suitcases and avoid twisting and lifting at the same time. 5. Walk at least every 3 hours if you are driving to avoid blood pooling in your legs. 6. Don't cross your legs when seated in the car. 7. Drink plenty of water to avoid dehydration (it will mean more bathroom stops but will make you walk more. :) 8 always have at least 2 days of meds in your carry on to avoid medication delays if your luggage is lost. 9. Be aware of your surroundings when stopping at gas stations or at hotels - park only in well lit areas and use bigger gas stations that have security cameras. I know that there are so many other things but these cover a few of the most common problems that arise when on the road or in the air.

The holidays also bring challenges in getting enough rest, healthy food and exercise so I hope you find time to really enjoy the blessings of the season and not put too much pressure on yourself to create the perfect holiday for your loved ones. God already did that with the birth of the Christ Child.
