February Greetings! We are in the liturgical season of Epiphany, when Jesus calls his followers and travels around – teaching and preaching as the Light of the world! So often, Epiphany is a natural

time to have a global focus, when we get to "travel" around through our worship and fellowship. So, for the majority of February we are going to "travel" by way of our Companion synods in worship and fellowship. If you're wondering what a companion synod is, here's the official definition from the ELCA:

Companion synod relationships of the ELCA connect Lutheran churches throughout the world with ELCA synods and congregations. These relationships are concrete expressions of the communion and fellowship with the more than 140 Lutheran member churches of The Lutheran World Federation. Each of the 65 synods has at least one international church companion and many have additional relationships, resulting in more than 120 companion synod relationships. These relationships are rooted in "accompaniment," which promotes the values of mutuality, inclusivity, vulnerability, empowerment and sustainability. Through the program, companion churches and ELCA synods nurture and strengthen one another for life and ministry through prayer, study, communication, exchange of visitors and sharing of resources.

Our companion synods for the Northeastern MN synod are Lutheran churches in India, Russia, and Honduras. And then we are also going to focus on Tanzania, because the Lutheran church has many ties there in general. We will have aspects of these countries in worship and a taste of these countries in coffee

fellowship as well!

Additionally, to go with our Global focus, our Growing Kids will be raising money for God's Global Barnyard. Your gifts to God's Global Barnyard support the sustainable development ministries of ELCA World Hunger, which include training, education, resources (and much more) to help the community care for animals and create new market opportunities like starting a small business selling eggs, meat or dairy products. Your gifts support this comprehensive approach to animal husbandry. We invite you to check out the God's Global Barnyard bulletin board and join them in their efforts!

This year, the Super Bowl of Caring offering that will happen on Sunday, February 2 and the Wednesday prior will go to God's Global Barnyard. Our goal is to purchase an entire Family Farm that will help a family break the cycle of hunger and poverty — for good. It consists of a cow, a couple of goats, a dozen chicks, two pigs, farming tools, seeds and agricultural training can create a world of opportunity for a family living in poverty. With eggs, milk and meat to eat and sell, and tools and training to increase the harvest, this gift can make all the difference.

Here's a great prayer from our hymnal for Global Mission: Almighty God, you sent your Son Jesus Christ to reconcile the world to yourself. We praise and bless you for those whom you have sent in the power of the Spirit to preach the gospel to all nations. We thank you that in all parts of the earth a community of love has been gathered together by their prayers and labors, and that in every place your servants call upon your name; for the kingdom and the power and the glory are yours forever. Wednesday, February, 5 Session 5: Determining Right from Wrong


Wednesday, February, 12 Session 6: The Many Meanings of the Bible

In the month of **December**, revenues exceed expenses by \$17,839.

YTD's performance is \$426 less than budget, because revenues are \$49,532 less than budget and expenses are \$49,106 less than budget.

Thank you so much for your generosity in time, talent, and treasure for the ministry and mission of Crosslake Lutheran Church! As you know, this past year, we went into the month of December with a financial deficit of around \$18,000. I am pleased to tell you that because of tremendous giving, our December financial report tells us we ended the year "in the red" by only \$426, thank you! It is important to add that in our December finance and council meetings, we discovered and discussed that there was also \$3,000 of budgeted benevolence that went unpaid for 2019. Because this same benevolence was actually cut from the 2020 budget, the council decided not to put our congregation further "in the red" for 2019 in order to meet those projected goals of the 2019 budget, since that was already eliminated from our 2020 budget.

Health Ministry

Greetings from sunny Texas. It has been picture perfect on the beaches of South Padre- I hope that for those who are experiencing the good old fashioned winter up north, you are finding ways to keep active, positive and healthy. In this time of darkness and not being outdoors, check with your provider if you need some additional Vitamin D to keep healthy since getting rays outdoors is unlikely. Symptoms such as low energy, increased aches and pains, brain fog and difficulty sleeping have been associated with low Vitamin D levels. It is best to talk to your provider re: dosing

rather than just coming up with your own ideas.

There are easy ways to improve

There are easy ways to improve mind, body and spirit health in the upcoming year. Ideally you should be exercising at least 150 minutes of

moderate intensity but if time is an issue, studies show that short periods of high intensity exercise has long lasting effects and can be equal to longer periods of moderate activity (high intense=unable to carry on a conversation due to shortness of breath) (check with your provider before starting any exercise program) Having a buddy to exercise with increases the likelihood that you will continue your exercise program as well as providing needed relationships that also improve health. Mental health can be improved by meditating as little as 10 minutes a day based on a number of research studies. You do not need to be silent while sitting cross-legged (hard to get out of that position for most of us) it can be simply being present in the moment instead of thinking of a thousand other things. When was the last time that you actually paid attention to driving? Healthy eating is also a way to improve health in the winter. A recent study in Australia showed that eating 8 servings of

fruits and vegetables per day (1/2 cup equals one serving) improved not only immunity but also mood and resiliency. There are so many fruit and veggie stands down here- I am having lots of great meals enjoying things that are hard to find up north — mangos, cheap avocados, jimica, fresh pico de gallo—just to name a few.

Plans are underway for the upcoming program year which will include many of our most popular programs. May will include

another Final Gift workshop and also Diabetes class and Falls Prevention course. If you know of any other courses that may be of interest, please drop me a line or let Becky or Connie know (since they are covering for me until mid March. There will be a "downsizing your

stuff" workshop at the Catholic church in May which is a wonderful presentation that is great for many of us as we start to get rid of stuff. I just helped my siblings start cleaning out my parent's farm house and what a job! It is nice to have the extra space in a house that also is easier to keep tidy when there is not so much stuff to dust around. More on that presentation in the future.

Thank you to all who are continuing the work of caring for members of our congregation in times of need. Sometimes it just means saying "I have extra food cooked, when can I drop it by?" Rather than saying "what can I do?" Many Lutherans including myself have a hard time asking for help so specific things that you are able to help with can be very supportive.

Have a great February — cheer yourself up by ordering gardening supplies and seeds- Spring is only 2 months away.

Sharing God's Bounty

Each household has its own routine. We go to work; we help the kids with their homework and attend their events; we make the meals, clean the house, and do the laundry. Our days are full — sometimes too full. So full that time for the Lord is abbreviated or omitted altogether. Then comes Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. It's just

what we need to get back on track. We gather together for worship. We hear again about Jesus' ministry, about the events that eventually lead up to his crucifixion, about his zeal for the Lord's house. We hear his prayer for his disciples and his words of comfort and preparation to them.



Our hearts are turned to Christ instead of toward ourselves. We ask for grace to love and serve as he did, sacrificing self for the good of others. "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). Paul comments, "Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Romans 5:7-8). God loved and chose us, the unlovely, to shed his grace upon. We are reminded that, "since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another" (1 John 4:11).

"Love one another." Not just our close

friends or those who agree with us, but "one another." We can't do it, can we? Some people are just too hard to love. Some people are not deserving of our gifts and our attention. Some people aren't interested in the love we have to offer. The command remains: "Love one another."

Now is a good time to read John 15.

Here we find the secret of loving and serving. Here we find the source of love, of faith, of everything we need. That source is Jesus. He is the Vine. He sustains and nurtures us, the branches. He enables us to bear fruit, to "love one another." He calls those who obey him. His friends and tells us he will give us whatever we ask in his name.

So we pray, Lord, let us "love one another."

Too often we fail to understand that Christian instruction about money is one of the best opportunities we have to teach our children about God's love for us, and his ownership of all things. The way we use money is the extension of our personal characteristics.

By teaching our children the Christian use of money, affording them control of money and the need to make decisions about money, we also confront them with the meaning of discipleship and Christian stewardship.
