February Greetings!

The season of Lent always begins on Ash Wednesday which lands on February 22 this year. That also happens to be the date I was ordained into the ministry of Word and Sacrament nineteen years ago! And if I've learned nothing else in my time of being a pastor it's that God is never finished with us as individuals or collectively as a congregation! God always keeps calling and working on our hearts and minds in big

and little ways throughout our lives. That brings us to our Lenten theme this year:

UNFINISHED: Discovering God's Call in the Not Yet written by Rev. Dr. Charlene Rachuy-Cox from Church Anew. Church Anew is a great on-line resource that comes from St. Andrew Lutheran Church in Eden Prairie also sponsored by Concordia and St. Olaf Colleges.

Our Lenten theme on Sundays and Wednesdays will help us experience how God keeps working on us in our different life experiences. Here's how the author of this series explains the Lenten theme of **UNFINISHED**: **Discovering God's Call in the Not Yet**:

We can probably all think of a host of experiences from our own lives in which we occupy the space between no longer and not yet. The space between before and after a medical diagnosis, before and after living with a loss, before and after navigating a relationship change, a job change, a move. The space between childhood and adulthood, young adulthood and midlife, midlife and the autumn years. The space between yesterday and tomorrow, your comfort zone and uncharted territory. The space between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday.

The church by its very nature, and we as people of faith, live our whole lives in the space between no longer and not yet. Cross-marked and Spirit-sealed, we dwell in the space between the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus and the final fulfillment of God's hope-filled promises. In this space between, we dwell in the unfinished as unfinished people. As John reminds us, "we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed." But we are not left alone in this space between no longer and not yet. We are not left alone to navigate this unfinished life by ourselves. God is here - present-tense, each and every day - calling to us, accompanying us, renewing and recreating us - over and over again.

Our worship on Wednesdays during Lent with this **UNFINISHED**: **Discovering God's Call in the Not Yet** theme will incorporate different prayer stations and activities that are for all ages as we move around the sanctuary a bit for some interactive creativity and time for contemplation. We hope you can join us for soup supper beforehand and these special Lenten times on both Sunday and Wednesday together as God's unfinished people!

UPDATE FROM THE CALL COMMITTEE

Dear Members of Crosslake Lutheran Church,

Pastor Kristin and I have been in regular contact with the Northeastern Minnesota Synod about our open associate pastor position, but it appears there are very few candidates generally, and so far, none who have expressed a specific interest in our congregation. At the moment, there are only two active full-time openings in our Synod. We've been advised that interest may pick up between Christmas and Lent. We wait patiently and prayerfully for the Spirit to work on our behalf!

We also know that the Spirit works through and with us, so we are turning to you for help! I expect that many of you have experienced job changes over your careers, as I have, and that re-entering the workforce required "networking" - reaching out to others for help in landing a position. Sometimes that included working with professional recruiters and scouring job postings on the web. There are some websites that post positions for other denominations, but this is not the practice of the ELCA. HOWEVER, we can spread the word in the best "Networking" tradition! Think of all of your contacts - it could be family, former colleagues, old (and new!) friends, and ask them if they know of someone (a pastor or deacon) in ELCA ministry or near seminary graduation looking for a new call. And, if the response is no, ask again if they have any ideas of others who might know of someone with a hankering to move on to an exciting opportunity with an active congregation (and a great ministry team!) in a beautiful part of the world.

If someone expresses an interest, you simply need to encourage them to go on the ELCA website where they will see our posting and be in touch with the Northeastern Minnesota Synod. The process of applying will be familiar to the folks in whom we'd be interested, so nothing further would be required (other than prayer!) on your behalf.

New Bible Study series starting February 8th!

It's been reported that sixty-five million adults in the U.S. have dropped out of active church attendance and about 2.7 million more are leaving every year. Have you ever wondered why it appears millions of people in this country feel that church life isn't "their thing?"

WHY YOUR BELIEFS STOPPED WORKING AND

Perhaps you are perplexed because people you care deeply about don't seem to care as much about attending, or participating in, any church? This 4-part series, led by Rocky Chapin and Ron Ommen, might be of interest to you.

Using his own story and the stories of a diverse group of struggling believers, Brian D. McLaren, a former pastor and now an author, speaker, and activist shows how old assumptions are being challenged in nearly every area of human life, not just theology

and spirituality. He proposes a four-stage model of faith development in which questions and doubt are not the enemy of faith, but rather a portal to a more mature and fruitful kind of faith. The four stages—Simplicity, Complexity, Perplexity, and Harmony—offer a path forward that can help sincere and thoughtful people leave behind unnecessary baggage and intensify their commitment to what matters most.

You can purchase the book on your own if you wish to read the book, but you don't have to read the book in order to join in on the discussion! Join us for a five part series on Wednesdays at 10AM!

In the month of December, revenues exceeded expenses by \$60,324.

YTD's performance is \$15,535 more than budget, because revenues are \$68,874 less than budget, however, expenses are also less than budget by \$84,409.

Crosslake Lutheran Church Columbarium

If you have ever considered purchasing a niche in the Columbarium, please consider a purchase in the new year. A second Columbarium unit was installed during the summer along with a new roof added to the first unit. There has never been a price increase since the original Columbarium was installed in 2008. During that time the price of the niches and shipping costs have risen 45%. The Columbarium Committee asked the church Council to approve a price increase at their December meeting and it was approved.

The new prices will take effect March 1, 2023. Until that time, you can purchase a companion niche (husband and wife) for \$1,500 which includes a bronze urn with a name plate plus a face plate tile that has the name of the deceased along with the birth and death dates inscribed. An individual niche, for one person, is \$1,500. A half niche is \$850; you pay for half and someone else can buy the other half.

The new prices, effective March 1, 2023 are as follows:

Companion Niche \$1,800 Individual Niche \$1,800 Half Niche \$1,000

If you are considering cremation and inurnment, please check out the Columbariums located in the vicinity of the existing cross and stained glass window located on the west side of the building. This is a great space for meditating, visiting a loved one, or just sitting quietly listening to the bubbling water (in the summer).

UKRANIAN REFUGEE NEEDS

I am sure many of you know there are thousands of Ukranian refugees that have recently been flown into Minnesota. They have left their homes and all their possessions, their pets and even some dear relatives in order to keep their children safe.



Those people have been taken into the homes of several kind people who are helping them get jobs, permanent places to live, drivers' licenses, work permits, etc. Others are living in rented space throughout the Twin Cities. Many are skilled laborers and professionals and will be able to recover their lives within a few months (language barrier notwithstanding).

Volunteers are gathering household items such as dishes, silverware, glasses, cooking pans, pillows, blankets, sheets... they have nothing and need everything according to the translator that I talk to. If you have any other these things that you are willing to part with, please call or email Gervaise Wilhelm (651-226-0380 or gervaisewilhelm8@gmail.com). You can drop off items at church as well, and I will pick up and deliver them to the Ukranian families in need.

HEALTH MINISTRY

Writing 2023 seems so weird. It will take me a few months to make that transition, my prayers are that it holds only good things after these past couple of years. COVID-19 is likely to be a part of our lives for some time yet, but we have learned so much in terms of prevention and treatment which should reduce the anxiety and fear that folks seem to be continuing to live with. If you find yourself living with ongoing anxiety, especially around health issues, it may be helpful to seek professional help since it can become a

health risk for mind, body and spirit health. Our natural tendency is to look for threats in our environment since that is how we survived as a species but if it becomes a pattern in life, there is an endless supply of things in the media to be anxious about. I do not believe that it is the way that God intended us to live, please reach out to me or Pastor Kristin if you need resources as to how to live in confidence that God is still in charge and that our needs will be met daily.

I am continuing to be working remotely from my southern home in Texas. I so appreciate all the many folks who are continuing the work of Health Ministry while I am

away. A special thank you to the new

Befrienders who have accepted the call of ministry for our congregation and the community at large. If you need more information about the program or believe that you would benefit from a visit by a member of the Befriender team, please reach out to me. It is such a comfort to have someone as a listening presence in our lives in times of challenges in our lives, sharing burdens make them lighter in my experience.

I will be presenting at a Cardiovascular seminar in April which is hosted by Minneapolis Heart Institute on the topic of Caregiving. The role as a caregiver can be a blessing as we minister to loved ones with mind, body and spirit needs but the role requires support so that the caregiver does not end up needing caregiving themselves. Caregiver.org is a great website that has information about a number of topics that are typically part of the caregiver role. I will be presenting a repeat of the seminar session for our community sometime after I return to Minnesota. There will also be a session for "The Final Gift", "Matter of Balance" and "Flying Solo" so watch the church calendar for these popular programs. If there are any additional topics that you have interest in, please do not hesitate to contact me or leave a message with Brenda.

In this time of winter it is important to find alternative safe ways to get your exercise in since our biology also leads us to pack on the pounds during winter to accommodate food shortage that our ancestors used to experience. The holidays are also a time of special treats that can lead to extra pounds and associated health risks so exercise may help shed those pounds. Research has shown that people change behaviors when they identify a problem, are aware of resources that can help, and believe that they can do something about the problem. If you have health issues that you need resources for, please let your health care provider know about your concerns so that you keep them informed of your concerns. I have a large collection of resources that are also available for a number of mind, body and spirit topics. Please see me if you have needs for information.

Prayers for health, peace and connections in this next year; I am just a phone call away.
