"Wilderness"

When I think of the word "wilderness," I am drawn to pleasant thoughts of a walk in the woods or a gentle paddle on a lake or down a river, perhaps for

exploration, perhaps for relaxation, but certainly for recreation. For the people of ancient times the wilderness was anything but a place of relaxation and recreation, but instead was an unpredictable place where identity was formed and community was built. It was not always pleasant, but it was always what they needed. To use some "boot camp" imagery, the wilderness was a place where you were brought to emotional and physical exhaustion and were left dependent on the instructors to build you back up again.

We are using the theme of **Wilderness** for our Lenten season. Sarah Are who has written quite a bit of the material we are using suggests that, "the wilderness is every single place of unknown, or when shame and fear enter my home," but then she also says that "the wilderness is everywhere that I start to grow." I think if we let ourselves have some creative imagination; we might find that much of our world right now feels like wilderness. Like the trainee, we can find ourselves depleted, lacking. But we are never alone.

God is present and active in our wilderness. And our brothers and sisters in faith are in the wilderness with us too.

Beginning on March 1st we will have our Sundays in the Wilderness at our normal 9:30am time with fellowship time to follow. The Sunday worship will be complimented with music, visual art, poetry, scripture, and more. While our Wilderness Wednesdays will share the wilderness theme, their content will be quite different. Our wilderness journey will begin with a nourishing soup supper at 5:30pm. The expansive faith experience will continue with worship at 6:15pm. Each week will feature a **NOOMA video** reflection from Pastor Rob Bell, Communion, and an invitation to prayer stations throughout the sanctuary space, and more.

Let's be honest folks, the wilderness we are living in, whether the wild of the political world, the raging river of personal health issues, or the hills and valleys of family or relationship struggles is disorienting. Come for Sundays in the Wilderness, come back for Wilderness Wednesdays, where together we will feel God loving, forming, encouraging, and sending us with fresh hope this Lenten season.

Bible Study for Lent: Wilderness

Our Bible Study for Lent will focus on the Sunday Scripture texts that will be in worship. We will

delve into the Gospel lessons, as you see them listed, great stories from the book of John, but also at times, the Old Testament, New Testament, and even Psalms that accompany them for the given Sunday. This is a great way to help prepare for worship, help give insight for the sermon, and continue your own journey to the Cross this Lent through discussion with the texts ahead of worship. to see other works of art that illustrate the story through Visio Divina – "divine seeing." Visio Divina is "a method of meditation, reflection, and prayer through a process of intentional seeing" – like a visual meditation.





We thank God for Reverend Herbert Chilstrom the First ELCA Presiding Bishop

The Rev. Dr. Herbert W. Chilstrom, 88, the first presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), died Jan. 19 at his home in Green Valley, AZ. He was born in Litchfield, MN, on Oct. 18, 1931.

He is survived by his wife of 65 years, Corinne (Hansen), also a Lutheran pastor; a daughter, Mary Cress of Mesa, AZ.; a son, Christopher Holt of Baltimore; and four sisters, Winnifred Christenson of Robbinsdale, MN;

Virginia Francis of Pickens, SC; Martha (Charles) Anderson of Ashby, MN; and Janet (Frederick) Sickert of West Linn, OR. He was preceded in death by his son Andrew; brother, David; and sisters Adeline Christenson (Earle) and Lorraine Juul (Dick).

Chilstrom completed academic degrees at Augsburg University, Augustana Seminary, Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago, Princeton Seminary and New York University, where he earned a Doctor of Education degree. He served Lutheran congregations in Pelican Rapids, Elizabeth and St. Peter, MN. He was professor and dean at Luther College, Teaneck, NJ, from 1962 to 1970. In 1976 he was elected bishop of the Minnesota Synod of the Lutheran Church in America (LCA). At the 1987 merger that created the 5.2-million-member ELCA, he was elected the first presiding bishop.

Chilstrom was awarded 15 honorary doctorates by 15 colleges, universities and seminaries. He was named a commander of the Royal Order of the North Star by King Carl XVI Gustaf of Sweden and received the Pope John XXIII Award for Distinguished Service from Viterbo University, the Servus Dei Award from the ELCA, and numerous other honors and awards. Chilstrom served on numerous boards of directors, including those of the Lutheran World Federation, Geneva, Switzerland (as vice president); Luther Seminary, St. Paul, MN; Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota; Gustavus Adolphus College, St. Peter, MN; and the National Council of Churches. He also authored numerous books and articles.

After retirement he continued to be active in church and community, preaching and lecturing in many parts of the country. He became a Minnesota Master Gardener, volunteering and serving as interim director at the Linnaeus Arboretum at Gustavus Adolphus College.

Health Ministry

Spring is just around the corner so I am told. This would be a good year to have an early spring since from the weather reports I watched about Minnesota shows this has been a cold and snowy winter. Planning is underway for many programs both old and new that will be held as a part of CLC's commitment to keep our community healthy in body, mind and spirit. Programming is geared toward things that have been identified as typical issues that cause illness especially as we age. According to www.healthypeople.gov.

in the most recent compilation of studies done in 2012, 60% of older adults managed at least 2 or more chronic conditions with the most common illnesses being heart disease, cancer, lung disease, stroke, diabetes and Alzheimer's.

Programs that we provide at Crosslake

Lutheran focus on healthy weight through our Diabetes prevention program, Heart & Soul which looks at heart disease in women and past programming related to Dementia. Programs also have the focus of injury prevention such as our "Matter of Balance" program. Falls are the leading cause of injury in older adults, are treated in the ER every 13 seconds and claim a life every 20 minutes. Every year, 1 out of 3 older adults fall yet less than half tell their doctors—although more and more office visits include a question about falls. It is wonderful that our church is a leader in disease prevention with most of the program costs funded by our yearly budget and our great partnership with Crow Wing Energized. Watch for future information about how to sign up for fall prevention and diabetes prevention- these classes are also open to the community. Planning is also continuing for the Senior

Expo which will be held on Saturday, April 25th. One thing for non-seniors to consider is that this expo includes a lot of information in terms of speakers and vendors for assisting our family members who have health needs. Approximately 25% of US adults 18 and older report providing care or assistance to a person with long term illness or disability in the past 30 days.

Caregivers are at increased risk for negative health consequences including stress and depression especially those caring for loved ones


> with dementias. Lakes Area Memory Awareness will be hosting a yearly forum mid-May in Nisswa. I have been asked to present at that forumwatch for more information about that. My mini-talk at the Senior expo will also focus on Memory issues watch for "Gertrude" to make a

What Have I Done for Him?

Lent is a season in the church year during which we particularly focus on the sacrifice Jesus made for us to pay the debt we owed for our sin. We know there is no way we can pay the debt ourselves. Only the sinless Son of God could do that. We have access to heaven only by grace through faith in Christ Jesus.

While we cannot repay Jesus for what he has done for us, his love does require a response. Paul, speaking of our ministry of reconciliation, wrote, "For Christ's love com-

pels us . . ." (2 Corinthians 5:14). We remain on earth to carry out the tasks which Christ left for us to do: to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, care for the sick, and visit the prisoner, (Matthew 25:31-46). James admonished us that ". . . faith by itself, if it is not

accompanied by action, is dead" (James 2:17). We provide the funds that support our pastors, teachers, and missionaries. Again, we can quote Paul writing in 1 Corinthians 9:11-12. "If we have sown spiritual seed among you, is it too much if we reap a material harvest from you? If others have this right of support from you, shouldn't we have it all the more?" Certainly each of us is addressed by the Great Commission: "Go and make disciples of all nations . . ." (Matthew 28:19). The following words from Frances Ridley Havergal

are a poignant reminder that Christ's love and sacrifice for us require a response:

Thy life was given for me, Thy Blood, O Lord, was shed

That I might ransomed by, and quickened from the dead.

Thy life was given for me, What have I given for Thee?

And Thou hast brought to me Down from Thy home above

Salvation full and free, Thy pardon and Thy love.

Great gifts Thou broughtest me, What have I brought to Thee?

We are saved by grace through faith for works. Let us pray for the desire to be good stewards of the gifts of salvation, health and wealth, and time and opportunity which God has given us that we might have a part in

the furthering of God's kingdom.

We need not give up the pleasures and luxuries of this life. God does not call us to be ascetics, but he does call us to a right sense of proportion in administering our substance.

The question is: "If I have this for myself, then what should I do for God?" This is the question into which the whole matter of stewardship resolves itself.
