March Greetings!

We are now in the season of Lent, our six weeks of holy reflection leading up to Easter. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, on March 2, as we remember "we are dust, and to dust we shall we return" with an ashen cross upon our foreheads and Holy Communion. Then our Lenten worship services continue through Wednesday,

April 6<sup>th</sup> with the theme "Jesus: Our All in All."



We'll have this theme on both the Sundays and Wednesdays of Lent as we sing various parts of the camp song "You are My All in All." Here are some of my favorite lines from that song as we sing to Jesus. "When I fall down you pick me up, when I am dry you fill my cup, You are my All in All . . . You are my strength when I am weak, you are the treasure that I seek . . . Jesus Lamb of God, worthy is your name."

As we sing together these powerful promises from our Lord Jesus Christ during these forty days of Lent, we will walk with Jesus to the cross. We will remind one another of God's promises, hear them in Scripture, and on Wednesdays we will also have a short video followed by a brief sermon with prayer and candlelight to help experience again these assurances from Jesus: Our All in All.

All our Wednesday Lenten worship services will be at 6:15 pm with a simple soup supper beforehand at 5:30 pm (peanut butter and jelly sandwiches available for those who don't care for soup!).

We hope you can join us on both Sunday and Wednesday for our Lenten worship during March, whether it's in person or through streaming, as Sunday and Wednesday will be quite different and compliment each other well.

Here's a good scripture verse for our Lenten days of Jesus: Our All in All.

The Lord said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness. So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me." 2 Corinthians 12:9



One of my favorite things to do was to walk rescue dogs from a nearby shelter. It made my walks so much more interesting and enjoyable even on the cooler days. #### MARCH FOODSHARE MONTH



The Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign\_brings together organizations, businesses, faith communities, and individuals to help keep 300 food shelves statewide stocked throughout the year. The 2022 March Campaign will run February 28th – April 10th. All food and monetary donations are welcome. At the

end of the program, the Crosslake Foodshelf will receive an additional % of monies available from MN Foodshare.
