Spring Greetings!

I am writing this on the first day of Spring, and it actually looks and feels like it could be Spring in MN in March! What a miracle! We can even see some little sprigs of green starting to make their way toward the light as God's beautiful creation reminds us of the new life that God promises to us in this Easter season. April begins with Maundy Thursday on April first, with the return of some "normal" programming as our First

Communion students from last year and this year (current fifth and sixth graders) are welcomed to the Lord's Table. After this last supper with Christ, we experience again Jesus' death on the cross on Good Friday. Then, on Easter morning, April 4th, we celebrate our Lord Jesus' resurrection from the grave, bringing new life for all. We will celebrate with worship services both in the sanctuary and parking lot at 8:30 and 10:30 AM. We hope you can join us for this festive worship of new life, especially as we experience this new life promising us hope and healing as so many continue to endure so much.

We are experiencing this Easter hope and healing, as a church as we continue to take our "baby steps" getting back to church life in the prior ways that we once knew! As more and more vaccinations become available and COVID cases are lower, we plan to continue with our 9:30 worship service that takes place in both the sanctuary and parking lot at the same time. We will also keep having Communion every Sunday as people exit the parking lot. We want to provide people with options, as some still prefer the parking lot, and the Pequot Lakes School District is still asking for everyone's help in keeping the community spread down as COVID cases have started to rise a bit again in the schools. We will keep doing our part! We keep on with our masks and all COVID precautions as necessary.

This month, more groups are wanting to meet indoors during the week. We thank all the groups that have already been meeting for following the COVID precautions so well. If you are a part of a ministry group that would like to meet at the church, please contact Brenda to reserve the time and space, and she will let you know the procedures as well (refer to **Current Gathering Options**). Thanks for your continued diligence and cooperation in keeping people healthy and safe as we gather indoors; it really is a contribution to the entire Crosslake community's well being!

As we look toward warmer weather some of us anticipate the Outdoor service. **We plan to start the Outdoor service on its "regular" schedule this year at 10:00 AM, on Sunday, May 23.** When the Outdoor service begins, we will stop the parking lot service and have our "regular" indoor service at 8:30 in the sanctuary. **May 23 will also be special as it will be our Senior Graduate Recognition Sunday!** And, here's the big news . . . we get to sit in chairs at the Outdoor facility this year! Alleluia! We've also decided that we will only need to be "masked on the move." So, once people are seated in their spots, they won't need to wear masks. Only people volunteering and those "on the move" who could inadvertently get closer than 6 feet to someone else will need to be masked! And we will be able to use the bathrooms as well. (No more portapotty!) That's good news!

But even more than all that, is the Good News of the Gospel! The Good News that despite it all, Christ is risen. He is risen, indeed! Alleluia! The Resurrection of Christ comes to us once again, through it all, bringing us new life and new beginnings, to heal and to renew. May you feel God's new beginning in you, however you need to experience it, this Easter season.

MARCH CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILY NEWS



"For You!" These words have been resonating in my head quite a bit lately. I have | had the privilege and joy of leading two great sessions with our fifth and sixth graders and their parents as they prepare to <u>receive their First Communion</u>. We talked about these words "For You." As we prepare to receive the sacrament, we hear them in the Words of Institution but often gloss over them.

In the night in which he was betrayed our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks: broke it, and gave it to the disciples saying: Take and eat: this is my body, **given for you**, Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is a new covenant in my blood, **<u>shed for you</u>** and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

In the distribution we hear them again as our server hopefully looks us in the eye and says, "This is the body of Christ, the blood of Christ, given, FOR YOU!" The server at that point is simply a vessel or a conduit. It is really Jesus meeting us, looking us in the eye, and saying, <u>"This is me, I give myself, for</u> <u>you and to you."</u> Our Lord shows up for us time after time helping us celebrate our joys, healing our hurts, tending to our grief, and moving us toward life and the joy of fully living.

As I write this, there have been several people in need of pastoral care in the last couple days, "For you" is God's presence in their hurts and ills. The hockey team is going to state and the basketball teams scrapped it out at sections, "For you" is God's presence in their joy, nervousness, and well-earned pride. But also, there are people whose depression, whose anxiety, or whose loneliness have engulfed them, "For you" is God's patient perseverance for them, sitting with them in them in their suffering. In not too long, we will be at the outdoor site, where the elements will be distributed in the midst of a beautiful creation and again, we hear the promise, "for you." On May 23rd our high school graduates will be recognized at the outdoor site, celebrating years of study, and years of Christ sustaining them with the promise, "for you." Soon enough KIDS KORNER is going to be finding a NEW STRUCTURE for the kids to hear Jesus to say, "for you," through the bread and wine, but also through activities and crafts.

God is good and indeed, "for you."

CURRENT GATHERING OPTIONS

9:30 AM Worship Service on Sunday Morning – Gather Indoor or in the Parking Lot in vehicles

9:30 Indoor Service – We ask that you park in the BACK LOT, so that those who are going to the Parking Lot service can be in front lot. The back door by the bathrooms will be unlocked for you to enter. There are handicapped spots there, too. You will be greeted and reminded to please use the hand sanitizer. Then, ushers will direct you, with your coat on into the sanctuary to the first available spot in the pew. (This may be an even better view than the seat you normally have!) Household groups will be seated together, physically distanced from other groups, as necessary for your protection. Face coverings are required in the building at all times. Don't worry if you forget your mask, we'll have extras. Please note if the modified capacity of the sanctuary is reached, we will ask those who exceed capacity to attend the Parking Lot service. The preaching pastor will preach from inside the sanctuary, so you will see that pastor indoors.

<u>9:30 Parking Lot Service</u> – Remains as it has been going. Park in a designated spot for fire safety purposes in the front lot facing the brown booth (pastor perch). Those coming to the Indoor service will park in the back. If the front lot is filling up, feel free to park in a front handicapped spot, even if you don't have a handicapped sticker. The pastor leading the liturgy will be in the perch for the service.

We will continue to have a song leader each Sunday. <u>We will also have Communion every Sunday.</u> For both the Indoor and Parking Lot services Communion and Offering nets will be "drive by" at your vehicle as people leave the parking lot through the two exits to County Rd 66 at the end of the service.

Church Facility Open by Reservation during the week:

In addition, the church facility is open by reservation. This means that if a group would like to meet for their activity (quilting, knitting, etc.) or a meeting, they may do so. Depending on the size of the group, it's optimal to meet in a room that has the furnace upgrade with the high quality filter system. (Unfortunately, this excludes the Fellowship hall, if your groups needs the Fellowship hall, this can be arranged, but please be aware the filters are not able to be in this area. However, we did purchase a fogger that can be used in the evening to clean any area of the church.) The process is to call the church office number to reserve the room. Bible Study on Wednesday mornings will be at church. When you use a church space, each person needs to sanitize their hands, sign in on the sheet, and wear a face covering at all times. The kitchen will not be used, but people may bring their own beverages. You can talk with Brenda, our office manager, about what room best suits your needs, and how to lock and unlock the door, if needed.

Please note that while the sanctuary and meeting rooms are opening, we still aren't opening the entire church building. Out of care for our community, we request that if you have been at a church gathering and test positive for COVID 19 shortly afterwards (because we know this virus is unpredictable!), please let us know. We will email out a brief notification, keeping identities anonymous, but letting people know they may have been exposed to COVID 19.

In the month of **February**, revenue exceed expenses by \$78,348. **REVENUES INCLUDE \$70,275 RECEIVED FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AS PART OF THE CARES ACT AND THE PPP LOAN FORGIVENESS.**

Revenues exceeded expenses from normal church activities would have been \$8,073. YTD's performance would be \$2,922 more than budget, because revenues are \$4,567 less than budget, and expenses are also less than budget by \$7,489.

NOTE FROM THE TREASURER:

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, also known as the CARES Act, was passed by Congress in early 2020 to react to the economic fallout of the COVID-19 pandemic. Part of this act was the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). The PPP was a loan program designed to help businesses and nonprofit organizations continue to maintain employment during the uncertain economic times of the pandemic. This loan was forgivable if the organization continued employment at pre-pandemic levels. Crosslake Lutheran Church received \$70,275 as a loan from this program. Thanks to this loan, and the continued generosity of our congregation, CLC has been able to keep all employees at pre-pandemic level during this time. As a result of this continued employment, our PPP loan of \$70,275 has been forgiven in February and will be included as revenue for the rest of 2021. In order to reflect more accurately the financial position of the church, a note will be included each month to show what CLC revenue would have been both with and without this one-time gift.

CLC does not qualify for an additional loan from the PPP Second Draw.

Happy Spring! It feels like resurrection for those of us who are now coming out of COVID-19 quarantine after receiving our vaccines. If you have questions about if you should or where to get your vaccine, please contact your provider or call me if looking for vaccine sites. MDH has a service called VACCINE CONNECTOR which will help you find both local and area sites where you can sign up. I am so glad that the age restrictions were essentially lifted since health risks should be considered in addition to age. I have seen a few 40 year-olds that have been much less healthy

than some of our 90 year-olds. :-) I hope that with more folks fully vaccinated, we will see more comfort in coming indoors for worship- I really believe that part of our worship experience is the fellowship of being with other believers. What will it take for you to feel safe rejoining worship? We have all needed safety protocols in place. Come and see part of some familiar faces :-)

Thank you to all who participated in the past weeks of Bible study as part of our Lenten series. If you missed the one that I did, we looked at ways to MOVE our Body, Mind and Spirit. Most of you know that you need at least 150 minutes a week of movement in order to stay healthy or to prevent disease that is related to inactivity. There are many ways to move our bodies. Donna Kieffer's exercise class is up and running at the Community Center and this type of exercise class allows you to see folks which is also needed for mental health. Moving can be as simple as getting up out of your chair every time a commercial comes on during your favorite TV program. Crosslake Lutheran Health Ministry in collaboration with Crosslake Cares and Interfaith Volunteers will be manning a phone line for anyone needing rides to vaccine appointments. The number to call is 218-546-3233. Information will be collected and then forwarded to Interfaith for connecting you with drivers. This call-in service will be active from 1-5 pm Monday thru Friday and is for seniors who already have a vaccine appointment, but need a ride. We are happy to partner with Interfaith Volunteers who have vetted drivers. They will need at least a 48 hour notice in order to arrange rides.
