Dearest people of Crosslake Lutheran,

This is the last official piece I will write to you. It seems my heart is existing in two places. One is in the sadness of leaving so many beautiful relationships. We have a good run of being 'Jesus' people' together. You and I have exchanged ministry to, and for, each other. I have been there in many of your tough times and you have been there in mine. So yes, I am sad. And that is ok. My heart is also filled with excitement.

I have parked at the word, **'exhilarated**,' to describe the anticipation of serving a new people, living in a new area, and essentially learning to live in a whole new 'military' way. I believe that my gifts and abilities will meet many people where they are at, whether on ship, on base, or on deployment. My heart, our hearts, have been made big enough for all that we are feeling.

We are people of the resurrection. It used to baffle me when Christian leaders would say "<u>We are</u> <u>Easter people."</u> I would wonder, "How can we be **people of a holiday**?" But as I uncovered more, as I have lived and worked among you, I have begun the process of understanding what it means. All the resurrection stories are filled with sadness, with feelings of 'lostness.' Jesus is dead. Then, the truth is literally, 'uncovered.' Jesus, in fact, did not die, but has been raised. Great! The people thought...back to what we know, walking the roads with Jesus, preaching and healing. But then Jesus ascended, giving Jesus' 'perma-Spirit,' a ubiquitous presence, albeit one that needs some discerning, some looking, to find the glory and peace of its presence and power. They did not go back to the same old; they went forward to the 'new old'.

That is where we live! <u>We live in the mystery and majesty of Easter</u>. We know that our Lord has been raised. We know THAT TRUTH will change EVERYTHING. That truth will offer new possibilities and new hope every day. That is, if we let it. Or, we can sit in lament of what is gone and keep wishing we could turn back the clock. But folks, that is like wishing the soggy wet dead leaves that lay on the ground would re-attach to the tree. No, we get new leaves, new growth, new saplings pushing up in the fertile soil made by the decay of things that have gone by. I have tears now as I type this because this is what we have discovered together. WE ARE EASTER PEOPLE. WE ARE EASTER PEOPLE! Together we have learned to grieve what is lost, but together we have learned to experiment and practice letting the ubiquitous Sprit of Jesus breathe possibility into our present to redefine our future. <u>THAT, is your legacy for me.</u> We learned it together. We learned how to be Easter People together. I will carry it as fuel and hope for my new call as I trust that that is the way you will live as I leave.

Well it is spring, at least on the calendar. As I am writing this, I am watching the snow come down in big clumps, so not enjoying winter (even though I missed most of it). As we all re-emerge from the winter of time spent in rest and contemplation, there is a sense of excitement for what is coming in terms of spring and of course, the Easter celebration. As with the seasons, it is important to feel the rhythm of seasons of resting, doing, releasing and celebrating - it gives me connection to the flow of life which is very healing. I hope that you have ways to connect to that

healing rhythm - it keeps us grounded, growing and releasing what no longer serves us. One way to feel the spring rhythm is to plan some type of garden, either in the ground or in containers. I love spending time planning my flower gardens and hope to find space in a community garden somewhere, although it is so easy to go to the local farmers markets and enjoy the fruits of someone else's labors. I so enjoyed eating fresh fruits and vegetables that were readily available in Texas, it was easier to get in the 4-5 servings daily which is recommended.

April will bring resumption of our busy program season with "FLYING SOLO" happening on April 28th from 12:30- 4:30 pm. This class if for anyone who has experienced a loss of relationship through death or divorce to create a new life as a single person.
