The music had a bright yellow cover with a butterfly on the front, and I think we need these promises from God right now about Spring and the power of the Resurrection, especially considering this long winter that we've been enduring! Maybe some of you are familiar with this song, too . . .

In the Bulb There Is a Flower (Hymn of Promise) by Natalie Sleeth

# WEDNESDAY, APRIL 5 - FIRST COMMUNION BREAD BAKING

No Wed activities other than bread baking as it's Holy Week. We will meet at 6:15 pm in the Fellowship Hall. We will bake the bread and then go through the logistics and practice for Thursday, April 6th. We will finish at 7:15 pm. Please have one parent or grandparent/relative attend with your student on this night.

#### THURSDAY, APRIL 6 – FIRST COMMUNION IN WORSHIP

Thursday, April 6th at 6:15 pm – Maundy Thursday Worship service

Please try to have the youth and at least one parent at the church by 5:45 or so. The whole family is welcome at that time too. It helps to arrive early to breath and relax, and so that we can go over the instructions and worship roles one more time. The service begins at 6:15. This worship service is unique. We do things differently because we are remembering this is a HOLY WEEK. At the end of the service, we will darken the sanctuary, put black fabric on the cross, and then leave the sanctuary in silence. After most of the people have left in silence, you are welcome to come back in and take pictures.

Here is how the "First Communion" part will go. About two-thirds through the service we pray the Lord's Prayer. Then we have communion. The 5th and 6th graders and their families will go first, two families at a time. One on each side. ANYONE who came with you to support your youth is welcome to come up! The family will kneel or stand at the rail. The pastor will commune the 5th or 6th grader first. Then the 5th/6th grader will come behind the rail and work with the pastor to commune the rest of the family. When everyone from your family is done, the family will stand up and go back to the pews and the next family will come up. When we are done with the 5th and 6th graders and families, we will commune the rest of the people.

# YOUTH—LOOKING AHEAD!



## APRIL BIBLE STUDY



# Wednesdays at 10 am

## April 12, 19 & 26 and May 3

Beginning with Jesus' birth, Ken Bailey leads you on a kaleidoscopic study of Jesus throughout the four Gospels. Bailey examines the life and ministry of Jesus with attention to the Lord's Prayer, the Beatitudes, Jesus' relationship to women, and especially Jesus' parables. Through it all, Bailey employs his trademark expertise as a master of Middle Eastern culture to lead you into a deeper understanding of the person and significance of Jesus within his own cultural context. With a sure but gentle

hand, Bailey lifts away the obscuring layers of modern Western interpretation to reveal Jesus in the light of his actual historical and cultural setting. This entirely new material from the pen of Ken Bailey is a must-have for any student of the New Testament. If you have benefited from Bailey's work over the years, this book will be a welcome and indispensable addition to your library. If you are unfamiliar with Bailey's work, this book will introduce you to a very old yet entirely new way of understanding Jesus.


