What Makes Your Heart Sing?

1 My heart is steadfast, O God, my heart is steadfast; I will sing and make melody. Awake, my soul! 2 Awake, O harp and lyre! I will awake the dawn. 3 I will give thanks to you, O Lord, among the peoples, and I will sing praises to you among the nations.

SOLAR PANELS

March was a first for our Solar Power generation. Even with March's many cloudy days, the sunny days produced enough power to completely offset our monthly use resulting in a \$0.0 bill! The best season for our power generation is yet to come, with the longer days (up to 7 hours longer) and no snow cover. We are excited about how well the system is performing and look forward to a good year of savings.
