MEMORIAL DAY SUNDAY SERVICE MAY 29, 2022

The annual Crosslake Lutheran Memorial Weekend services will be held Sunday, May 29th. A more traditional worship service will be held at 8:30 am in the sanctuary. The 10 am Outdoor Worship will feature a larger 'community-wide' Memorial Weekend observance.

This year's speaker will be Melony Butler, the Chair and Director of the Eagles Healing Nest which is located in Sauk Centre, Minnesota. The Eagles Healing Nest is a nonprofit organization committed to meeting the needs of veterans who suffer from the invisible wounds of war. The organizational vision includes "that those who served our military not to live in darkness but to bring them into the light to soar and fly free. To help restore the honor, dignity, pride and purpose each deserves."



The outdoor service will feature the National Anthem sung by John Carlson, a contingent of the Crosslake-Fifty Lakes American Legion Color guard firing an honorary salute to the dead, and an aerial fly-over (weather permitting) by the North Star Squadron (a group of four fixed wing aircraft flown by experienced pilots who participate in air shows throughout the Midwest). Veterans from World War II to the present will be honored.

Transition Time Update

At the April Council meeting, the council appointed a very short-term transition team to meet, review our Ministry Site Profile from 2019, and make recommendations for a path forward for our congregation. This team made up of Bob Bahma (Personnel), Jeff Benson (President), Rocky Chapin (Council), Karen Christofferson (Personnel), Paul Tender (Treasurer), and Pr. Kristin recommended that we move forward with forming a Call Committee to look for a Minister of Word and Sacrament (Pastor) or a Minister of Service (Deacon) for General Ministry with a preferred emphasis in young families. They also recommended that for the transition time we look for a Coordinator of Children's Ministry, and then eventually see how that position may or may not work with the person we call.

We are aware that there are many variabilities to whom may be available to serve and how, their experience level, etc. This affects their suitability in various ways including our budgetary needs; with that in mind, what we simply need to do is get our paperwork done to see who might feel called to serve our congregation. Therefore, at the May Council meeting, the council proceeded forward with these recommendations and is in the process of appointing a Call Committee of 7 people per the church constitution. The Call Committee will refine our 2019 Ministry Site Profile and hopes to have it submitted to the council, then the synod, later this summer. It's important to have a Call Committee with a nice representation of gender and age, including a youth. If you are interested in serving on the Call Committee, please let a council person know!

- Kids Korner (Summer 2023)


While there would not be "regular" hours, this job would be paid as if it were 10 hours a week.

It has taken our group to another level as people from outside our congregation join us. Also, word of mouth has increased our numbers. Our Crosslake Lutheran Church Singles' Group has evolved. We have original members from our diners' group, as well as new members who have joined our group, taking the step to meet new friends and to build our support systems. We need each other, simply put.

We meet monthly, gathering at a restaurant to share a meal and a chance to visit. We have been known to stretch our lunch out to 2 hours, we enjoy each other's company so much! You will find kindness and acceptance in our group, and the time together will enrich your life. We celebrate with you as God works through us, around us, always by our side. We are thankful for the opportunity to find healing, peace, and comfort going through the most tragic experience of our lives. In our group many have lost a spouse through death, some many years ago and too many in these Covid years and the isolation that kept us home.

Blessings to all - thank you to so many working to make the Memorial Day Service a success. For those of you looking for a way to be part of service as a member of our faith community, please consider signing up for the Outdoor service work group or so many other ways that are available for you to put faith into action. It is also a great way to connect with so many special folks who can become your next best friend especially for those

who are transplants to the Crosslake area. **The Wild Ones are also another way to connect** especially for those who do not have a spouse; check with Kitty Daniels if you have questions or interest in that group. In a recent "Flying Solo" class, the most common thing that folks mentioned was the hardest is to attend church since it is a reminder of their loss. It is my hope that you can find community and connection through being part of the many service teams that meet regularly. One way that you can consider is to be part of our Befriender team with a new Befriender session to occur in mid-June. Through discernment, it is important to find ways to live out your calling in the world but for many, it is something that is given little thought. How does the Spirit speak to you in sometimes subtle ways that your life has a purpose and that there are ways to live out that purpose every day?

Thank you to the folks who have served through our Angel Food ministry this month. A special thanks goes out to Connie Caspers for her wonderful and tasty dishes as part of the program. If you are in need of short-term food support, please contact the church office. We will doing some group cooking in early June so watch for that in the church bulletin. Thank you also for those who took the time to attend the Final Gift workshop. I hope that each of you has completed an Advanced Directive and has it on file with your medical provider. The document only goes into effect if you cannot speak for yourself which includes serious medical issues but should also include if you are unable to make competent decisions because of dementia. I am so blessed that my father completed his directive while he was able to express his wishes to not only me, but also his health provider, which made it easier for our family to provide for my father's end-of-life care in a way that we knew respected his wishes. If you have questions or concerns about filling out the forms, I am always available to meet you with individually.

May was Mental Health Awareness month. Studies show that there is a significant increase in anxiety, depression and social isolation as a result of many factors in our society including ongoing COVID concerns. While it is human to focus on our concerns and at times be weighed down by those worries, it is important to find ways that bring peace of mind and happiness. If you need to find mental health resources, please see me for ideas of what might be helpful. There are many online resources through you tube and other online platforms that can connect you to groups or programs that may be helpful. I hope that you will reach out if you need ideas. I hope to bring a class on healing through sound sometime this summer which is another way to generate feelings of well-being. Covid Update as of May 19, 2022

<u>Unfortunately, as of May 19, the CDC data for Crow Wing county has shown an uptick in Covid</u> <u>cases with our community level changing from low to medium.</u> We want to keep you informed as we have all along following CDC data and recommendations. We'll use their most recent website tool: <u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/covid-by-county.html</u>

This website helps communities decide what prevention steps to take based on the latest data. Levels can be low, medium, or high and are determined by looking at hospital beds being used, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID-19 cases in an area. New levels are calculated and updated each Thursday.

We will post the recommendations for each level as they are below along with the most recent level (low, med, high) on the doors to the church each Thursday and it will remain there for the week so you can make the most informed decision for yourself and your own risk level at any church function indoors.

Low Level Recommendations

Stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines. Get tested if you have symptoms. Wear a mask if you have symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19. Wear a mask on public transportation. You may choose to wear a mask at any time as an additional precaution to protect yourself and others.

Medium Level Recommendations – Crow Wing County level as of May 19, 2022

Stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines. Get tested if you have symptoms. Wear a mask if you have symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19. Wear a mask on public transportation. You may choose to wear a mask at any time as an additional precaution to protect yourself and others. If you are at high risk for severe illness, consider wearing a mask indoors in public and taking additional precautions.

High Level Recommendations

Wear a mask indoors in public and on public transportation. Stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines. Get tested if you have symptoms. If you are at high risk for severe illness, consider taking additional precautions.
