WELCOME ASSOCIATE PASTOR BECKY SWANSON!

At the special Congregational meeting on Sunday, June 25th, the vote was overwhelmingly in favor of calling Pastor Becky as our part-time Associate Pastor! She will begin her call on July 1st.

Pastor Becky Swanson began ministry in 1986 at Gustavus Adolphus Lutheran church in NE Minneapolis in the area of music and children's ministry. She served in four other congregations (Lake of the Isles Lutheran, Glen Cary Lutheran, St. Anthony



Park Lutheran, and Bethel Lutheran) in the Minneapolis and St. Paul area synods before taking a call to Trinity Lutheran Seminary, in Columbus, Ohio to serve as Director of Contextual Education.

After Trinity and Capital University (the ELCA university across the street) merged, she returned to congregational work in Holmen, Wisconsin as an interim pastor. During this time, she worked with the bishop and synod candidacy committee to reform her call from Word and Service to Word and Sacrament. She was ordained as a Pastor in February of 2020 and served Advent Lutheran in Morton, IL before returning to her home state of Minnesota in April 2022. She is currently On-Leave-from-Call and serving the NE Minnesota Synod as a supply preacher. She is on the synod's LGBTQIA+ Welcome committee and the Together Here Ministries team.

In addition to her ministry, Becky spent over 25 years in Fortune 100 companies based in the Twin Cities in the area of Learning and Development, Leadership Development, and as contracted eLearning design and developer. In addition to supply preaching she has her own practice as a Leadership and Life Coach (at beckyswanson.com) where she helps folks live into their true vocations, whatever that may be. She is a graduate of Augsburg University, and Luther Seminary.

She lives near Garrison in the woods, with her husband, Gary Anderson, and their two dogs, Freyja and Josie and is VERY glad to be closer to grandchildren, multiple circles of friends, and weather that makes sense — even if it makes her face hurt sometimes. She likes to hike and forage; she grew up fishing and is thinking about asking her nephews to teach her to hunt.




I am so excited to be here, big things are happening!



HEALTH MINISTRY

I love summer, but with the Fourth of July coming up fast, it always seems like it is half over by then. I hope you find a lot of fun things to do over the holiday—so many choices. **Please remember to consider safety when gathering especially if it involves the water and water activities.** It is easy to lose track of those grandkids and guests who may not be used to lake safety. It is also important to have a little "safety briefing" for guests who may not know how things work at your house. In a recent CPR class , we talked about posting your address in a easy to find place like on the fridge in case of needing to call an



ambulance on your cell phone since your guests would not know it. We have wonderful EMS assets in the area including first responder, fire and law enforcement, but they need to be able to find you. We also talked about having or using a smart watch to call for help since many have GPS location function. There are many ways that technology can keep you safer such as atrial fib monitoring devices that connect right to your cell phone

that enable you to do a rhythm strip that can be sent to your doctor. Much easier than running into the clinic if you are worried that you may be in atrial fib. Of course, if you are having symptoms such as shortness of breath, nausea, sweating or chest pain, you would seek 911 support to get you to the hospital more safely and they can start therapy in route to the hospital.

The Fourth of July weekend also has a few additional concerns for safety, especially if fireworks are part of your celebration. Sparklers are typically used with kids but remember that the temp can reach over 1000 degrees and can cause eye injury and burns. It is so much safer to watch city or lake fireworks that are set off by professionals so that the Fourth of July holiday is not ruined by injury. It is also important to remember that pets may become frightened and run off during the big noises so making sure that they are safe especially if you have guest doggies in your home. Another concern is the traffic in downtown Crosslake. It is especially important to keep your eyes on the road and anticipate people turning, stopping or generally not following the rules of the road. I suggested that our church sign should say "keep your eyes on God and the road" -) If you are biking, please do so single file as not to wander into the traffic which may or may not be paying attention.

July will include a "Flying Solo" class which is geared toward those who have lost a significant other through death or divorce. Watch for flyers, bulletin notices and news releases. Even if you have already attended, feel free to come back since our needs and feelings change over time as we move through the next part of this chapter in life. If you have questions, please see me.
