August Greetings!

One of my favorite prayers comes from Paul to the community at Ephesus. It's a perfect prayer for this summertime as we are enjoying so many wonderful opportunities to connect as a community in Christ. You'll find the prayer in Ephesians 3:16-19.

"I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit, and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God."

Besides our regular times of worship and Bible study, you will find many unique opportunities inside this newsletter for connection as a community in Christ in which I hope you will participate! Besides these, there's one more opportunity to connect with others that perhaps you haven't thought about in this way. **It's volunteering to help on a Sunday morning. This is a wonderful way to connect with our Christian community and meet people whom you didn't know before or to have new conversations!** Sometimes, we might think of handing out a bulletin, pouring a cup of coffee, helping with Kids Korner, or parking a car as simply a task that needs to be done. But for task-oriented people (like me!) sometimes we need a reminder of the opportunities for connection that Christ puts before us on a weekly basis.

Over the past few months, we pastors have had the opportunity to have these key conversations of the importance of connections in Christ and Christian community as our church has fully opened, and we've so enjoyed all our in-person connections again. In some cases, (myself included!) we've needed to remind ourselves of "how things go" and that our connections in Christ are just as important and often more important than the task at hand as we continue to strive for excellence in ministry, all for the glory of God! **This is always the balance we seek, in wanting to carry out our ministry as effectively as we possibly can, while at the same time, compassionately tending to people and the relationships God is creating among us.** We are grateful that we have such a warm and welcoming congregation, and we want to keep that gracious hospitality front and center in carrying out God's mission. This includes maintaining an atmosphere in which both visitors and long-time members who try something new (a small group or helping with something) feel welcome to engage. We work not to make assumptions that people know how things go, past traditions, etc. This means all of us constantly working together, in God's grace-filled community to help one another with this hospitality and compassion as we live out Paul's prayer for community together serving God, one another, and the world.

What a wonderful Christian community God has given us to share Christ's love with one another and the world!

They could be super exciting things like birthdays and faith experiences...hint hint hint, they could be getting a tooth filled :(or, they could be memorials of something gone by. We all had our filled calendars in the early spring of 2020. And then the world changed. The normal pattern of life our calendar established and preached was obliterated.

As our Topical Bible Study suggests, we are in a new normal. We are coming out of an unprecedented time in most people's history. We went around the table in the first session of that "New Normal" bible study saying our names and one word that described the last 16 months. The word 'lonely' was a common theme. The calendar knows nothing about our lives until we make it known. So now the way we are filling in our calendars in a new way. The power of connection and sharing life together has never been so important for people. So, the way we are making the calendar know our lives and world has changed. Spending time with each other has become very important for many people.

The first Sunday after the first full moon in the spring came and went, came and went. It was another day and date on the calendar. Then the empty tomb happened. Easter happened. The fullness of life prevailed over the force of death and darkness. After that event, people made their calendars know about their faith and how it informed their lives. We are coming out of a world changing event too. We have lost much. We have gained much. What should we put in the little squares? Time to share our hurts? Time to celebrate our joys? Time for trusted relationships for both to be shared? Time to hear and share the power and capacity of Jesus love to heal, restore, and make new? Or, that the garbage can needs to be out on Thursday? What will we make our calendars know about our lives and our faith?

PSALM 23 AND ME

In the message I preached on July 18th, I did some wondering with you about Psalm 23. It is probably the most used psalm in the whole Psalter or “collection of 150 psalms”. It is very often a psalm selected for funerals. It is quite appropriate for that, but as I indicated in my message it is not just a psalm that offers comfort in death but offers lifegiving and inspiring words for living. In my studies of the psalm, commentators have helped me uncover untapped thoughts, untapped visions of God’s loving care for me. At the end of my message, I offered my own version of Psalm 23 based on my studies and life experiences. It is...and is not scripture. Many people have approached me asking for a copy of it so I am sharing with all of you. I hope it is helpful to you in your life of faith. - Pastor Kurt

The Lord is my Shepherd, even and especially when I don’t want it.

The Lord is a force that opens my eyes to abundance when all I can see is scarcity.

The Lord holds me still so I can catch my breath and be restored.

The lord holds my hand as I travel in the righteous grooves God has revealed in my time alone with God.

Even in the darkest canyon, I know that evil and selfishness have no claim on me.

I am comforted by your abiding presence Lord.

You set up camp, especially in the worst of my suffering, in the worst of my...my my my problem.

When you stroke my head. I feel generously complete.

Your goodness and mercy, your promises, have lights and sirens that chase me,
Driving me into your safe embrace again and again and again.

Amen.

YTD's performance would be \$20,180 less than budget, because revenues are \$42,769 less than budget, and expenses are also less than budget by \$22,589.
