

We continue to be grateful to have Pr. Ryan's help during this transition period. For Bible Study in August, Pr. Ryan will be leading a three-part series the first three Wednesdays of August at 10AM. The rest of the Wednesdays in August, we will take a break from Bible Study until we start up again in September after the school year begins again!

Speaking of transitions, we also regretfully accepted the resignation of Pat Netko, our youth director, who's last official day was July 31<sup>st</sup>, due to unforeseen circumstances at her store. You can read her note inside the newsletter if you didn't receive the email that was sent several weeks ago. We are grateful for Pat's 20 plus years of ministry at Crosslake Lutheran and are planning a reception to honor her in September. Stay tuned for details.

We ask that you continue to keep our congregation in prayer through these times of transition, and when you hear of a ministry opportunity please, jump in and do it! As Jesus calls, "Follow me" we are empowered to say "Sure, I'll try that," to an opportunity in serving even when we're not exactly sure if we will be good at it or like it! 

#### "Places People Need To Find"



Get out your old map. Bring your Google Map. Or just trust the printed map available our class!

We are going on a journey without ever leaving the Fellowship Hall. Take time to study important places of the Old Testament, the New Testament, and places "outside the Scriptures" which had a great impact in what we believe. # **HEALTH MINISTRY**



Blessings and prayers that all is well with you and yours. The summer is zipping by and I can hardly believe that school shopping and winter clothes are already out in some of the stores. It helps reinforce my belief that our world really encourages not being in the moment and looking ahead to what could or you want to happen. As I look ahead to this fall in terms of planning, some things are going to change which is out of my control. "Heart and Soul" is something that we have hosted for the past 10 years with our partnership with Minneapolis

Heart. This year, Dr Fenstad is not available to present so we will not our usual evening for women's heart health, which is disappointing, but a change that we must just roll with. Another change is that I have heard from our flu shot vendor that they have discontinued their program to provide Flu Shot Clinics in the state (Hennepin county budget cuts wiped out the department responsible for the program). So unless I can find another source for the vaccine, we will not be hosting our usual clinic in October. Another change to just roll with but vaccines are readily available at local clinics, pharmacies etc. so that should not be a barrier for anyone who attended previous clinics (theirs will not include fresh cookies, music and special band aides for some of you :). Change is something that often we cannot control but seek new ways to cope, understand and find new ways to do the thing that needs to be done. Our faith can provide comfort and direction in that all that we need will be available at the perfect time according to God's plan for us and the world at large.

One of the roles I have as a parish nurse is to help people transition to other living situations as they experience a decline in their ability to care for themselves or others. All too often I see that people do not always think proactively about what the next steps are in terms of when it is time to move from independent living to one that has the help that they need. There are ways to stay in your own home as long as physically possible, but finding those helping resources can often be complicated or involve many steps. Please reach out to me or your health care provider for referrals before "the wheels come off the wagon" if you are looking for those resources or just need someone to help you know about options available.

I am excited that "Matter of Balance" classes will start up again in September. There has been a shortage of instructors but so glad that we will again host the 8-week class that works to prevent falls which are one of the leading causes of injury and death as we age. Signups for the class will be available soon, so please watch the bulletin for information.

The new 988 mental health crisis line is now up and running which will provide a direct line to mental health resources including over 200 local crisis call centers around the country. This line replaces the national suicide hotline which included a regular phone number that was hard to remember. If you are in need of mental health help there is also a new mental health support group at the Cuyuna Regional Medical Center which meets either from 2-3:30pm or 6:30-8pm on the last Monday of each month at the hospital. It is free, non-denominational and supportive with an emphasis on building skills to cope with life's challenges. Please see the CRMC website for more information.

The Diabetes Prevention class information is also included in the newsletter this month that will be again run by Becky Kalton. What a better way to find a healthier way to eat and have a positive relationship with our bodies and food.

# Lifestyle CHANGE Class Offerings


Learn how to create a healthier lifestyle and prevent diabetes in a 22 session diabetes prevention program. Groups meet with a trained instructor to help participants lose weight, eat healthier and increase physical activity. There are 16 sessions offered over 6 months, and 6 monthly follow-up sessions for the remainder of the year. Each session is one-hour long. The National Diabetes Prevention Program is a community-based, lifestyle change program that offers diabetes prevention education and support for people with pre-diabetes. Pre-diabetes involves blood sugar levels that are higher than normal, but not yet high enough to be diabetes. An individual with pre-diabetes can delay or prevent type 2 diabetes by making simple lifestyle changes. Diet and moderate exercise resulting in a 5 - 7% weight loss (usually about 10 - 15 pounds) often work to bring blood sugar levels back down to a healthy range. There is no fee for this class (\$429 value).

We support Midwives for Haiti in addition to sending kit components to DfG distribution centers so they can quickly answer calls for help. DfG International recently sent over 30,000 kits to assist the Ukraine refugees.
