Kids, Growth, Faith, Wednesdays, and Milestones

My wife Kelly and I have been doing some cleaning and sorting at our house. It included the spot on the top shelf of my office closet. It is the spot that was the drop zone for our kid's "stuff" for more than a decade. The stuff... is papers, projects, binders, artwork, and more primarily from their preschool and elementary education. They are things we hang onto because they represent milestones in our

kids lives as they have developed. Binders with the alphabet and words for each letter, the first paragraphs they wrote, and the art projects they did, or in some cases, attempted. Included in that shelf is their first learning of prayer, worksheets on the books of the Bible, and some evidence of early study of the promises given in the Apostles Creed. The list could go on. Going through that brings some vibrant memories, some tears, and also some great joy. We can see their growth and development in life and faith.

Growing Kids, our Wednesday faith formation for K-6 grade, produces some top shelf-worthy items: some art with a big boat, a flood, and a rainbow, colored pictures of Jesus with children in Jesus' lap, worksheets on Jesus being present in the storms of life. This year we will add to the collection opportunity to learn and grow with Milestones Ministry. Simply put, it is learning and sharing with parents and kids together around faith milestones like: learning to pray, exploring worship, interacting with the creed. Please pray for this new emphasis, pray for our kids and their families, and pray for God to continue to rise up leaders making faith experiments and experiences like this happen. Maybe one of those leaders is you!

We will continue with the dependable Faith Five model for all. SHARE. READ. DISCUSS. PRAY. BLESS. While our younger kids experiment with this, our older kids have learned to depend on it. Our senior speakers this spring, Cole, Mikaela, and Ethan all spoke of the power their small groups have had in their lives. Whether processing issues of life or exploring scripture, Faith Five small groups offer a trusted place, maybe the only place, where our 7-12 graders can be honest about themselves and the world they find themselves in. 
GOD'S GENEROSITY & OUR GRATITUDE BIBLE STUDY

In the month of **July**, expenses exceed revenues by \$10,360.

YTD REVENUES INCLUDE \$70,275 RECEIVED FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AS PART OF THE CARES ACT AND THE PPP LOAN FORGIVENESS.

YTD's performance would be \$15,534 less than budget, because revenues would have been \$44,145 less than budget, and expenses are less than budget by \$28,611.

MATTER OF BALANCE

- view falls as controllable set goals for increasing activity make changes to reduce fall risks at home
- exercise to increase strength and balance

- anyone concerned about falls anyone who has fallen in the past
- anyone interested in improving balance, flexibility and strength
- anyone who has restricted activities because of falling concerns

HEALTH MINISTRY



"Heart And Soul" Evening for Women is coming up soon, Thursday, September 2nd with doors opening at 6 pm. I hope to see you at this yearly event featuring Dr. Eric Fenstad – a cardiologist from Minneapolis Heart Institute (my other work home) who will be speaking on "Dispelling Cardiology Myths". There are things about women's heart health that we believe to be true but may not have any basis in fact or science—it could be a carry over from something you heard from a well-meaning friend or even the Internet in a Google search. I will spend the second half of the evening talking

about clearing things from our mind, body and spirit that no longer serves us. One of the books of inspiration is "The Gentle Art of Swedish Death Cleaning" by Margaret Magnusson, which is an easy but insightful way to clear things from your home before your family is stuck with the job of doing it after death. The evening also includes lots of door prizes and little gifts that remind us to spend time being inspired and for caring for ourselves.

Crosslake Lutheran will also be starting up two of our popular offerings through Crow Wing Energized. "Matter of Balance" is an 8-week course that starts on September 9th from 1-3pm that will be taught by Norma and Gina – two very talented educators who will talk about ways to reduce the risk of falls. Even if you have already gone through the course, it is helpful to have a refresher since things can change in terms of strength and flexibility as health changes. As in the past, this course is free because of a grant through Crow Wing Energized. Look for posters around church or check the bulletins for information on how to register; it is also open to the community. Another popular course that will start in September is the **Diabetes Prevention Class** which will be taught by Becky Kalton (via Zoom). It starts Tuesday, September 21st, 9-10am for 16 weeks and then a year of ongoing work and support. Again, this course is free and open to the community. Watch for posters, bulletin announcements and details on how to register for class.

Crosslake Lutheran is also participating in the **Senior Expo** on September 25th by providing volunteers and also being part of the Chili cook-off contest among the area churches. Thank you to Randy & Kristi Morsch for being the captains of the team. Remember to vote for our chili at the Expo! Paulette Wilske and myself will be doing a mini session about memory loss - watch for a new session with "Gertrude" who is trying to cover up the fact that her memory is fading. The Expo will feature a keynote address by Paul Douglas who stepped in after Don Shelby's illness kept him from attending. There will many vendors, other mini talks and door prizes as well. I know it is the same day as Jul Fest but you can make the rounds with everything that is happening in the city.

Another event still in the planning phase is a **session on Dementia** at the end of September or early October. There will be a presentation on dementia and a panel of caregivers who will talk about challenges in providing full time care. Watch for more details as well. The **Flu Vaccine Clinic** is on for October 26th to get the vaccine in before the flu season hits. By then we may know more about the booster shot process for COVID as well. Many thousand thanks to Jeff Benson who installed some beautiful soap dispensers in key areas in the church. Clean hands are one of the best ways to prevent disease of all types.

I hope that you are thinking about a way to spend winter long before it happens, especially if you have concerns about living alone in semi-isolation as the snowbirds leave. If you need ideas about how to stay safe at home or other options for the winter, please see me.
