

SOLAR - A NEW BEGINNING

The Energy Task Force has approached the Crosslake Lutheran Church Council to see if there is interest in a Solar Array being installed on the roof of the church. We believe this was a particularly timely request for two reasons. First, we are all experiencing higher energy costs which in fact are continuing to escalate with the price of natural gas now three times higher than it was just two years ago. Second, our new roof has a fifty-year life which aligns itself well with the life cycle of a Solar Array. The Council responded by asking the Energy Task Force to develop a Feasibility Plan and stipulated that the cost of the Array be fully funded by donors to a Solar Legacy Fund with no money being used from the General



Fund Account. The Task Force has agreed to develop a Plan which will include two upcoming Listening Sessions for church members to learn more about a possible project and ask questions. Please stay tuned for more information on this exciting opportunity for the congregation to save on future energy costs while also providing members a way to contribute to a lasting legacy.



DfG provides reusable menstrual solutions to women and girls mostly in impoverished countries so they can stay at work and in school every month when they have their periods. DfG has reached more than two million women and girls in 145+ countries with DfG kits and education about menstrual solutions, reproductive health and value as women.

We support Midwives for Haiti in addition to sending kit components to DfG distribution centers so they can quickly answer calls for help. DfG International recently sent over 30,000 kits to assist the Ukraine refugees.

HEALTH MINISTRY

My favorite season is just around the corner; prayers that we have a long and colorful season of fall with its many activities and crisp days. I hope that you have had a wonderful summer, often it gets so busy with company and fun, it becomes almost too much activity and goes by way too fast. Fall signals the beginning of the school year and return of some of Crosslake Lutheran's most well-attended programs. "Matter of Balance" class will start September 6^{th,} 2-4 pm. Please sign up through Crow Wing Energized on their website under classes. If you have

difficulty with that, please see the church office or me so that we can be sure you are on the list since class size is limited. "Diabetes Prevention" class also starts September 6th from 9-10 am; it is a great way to lose weight, establish better eating habits and make a commitment to exercise regularly (details on these two classes are on the next page). See Becky Kalton if you have questions about if this class is right for you.

Thank you to those who have chosen to attend the Befriender class this past month. The team has fluctuated from as many as 28 to as few as 11 but the program is still strong since there are wonderful people who are befriending folks especially for long-term partnerships. If you or someone else you know would benefit from having a Befriender or you just want to know more about the program, please see me. As strong Lutheran upbringings with a Scandinavian/German twist, I was not raised to ask for help and to really not let others know about family struggles, so for many of us, it is not easy to reach out in times where a listening presence may be helpful. If you are in that place in your life, know that these relationships are based on what you need and are confidential in nature. I try to partner you with someone that has the gift for whatever your situation. God works through the ministry of walking with others during times of joy and sorrow.

Please remember to stay home if you have any concerns about symptoms related to COVID especially if you have been exposed to someone with active infection. The most recent outbreaks are related to a variant strain that seems to be a bit more transmissible so home testing and talking to your provider if have questions about COVID is really helpful. Kits are readily available through drug stores, the VA and local clinics. The CDC asks that if you are high risk (diabetic, have immunity issues, heart disease, obesity, etc.) you should wear a well-fitting N95 mask if you are in public spaces especially with poor ventilation when transmission rates are high in the county. When in doubt, talk to your provider. I am glad that kids are able to attend school and mask mandates have been lifted; it has really impacted social interaction, learning and even safety for some kids. I hope that the fear, judgement, controversy and overload of conflicting information has subsided and that our lives can be lived without the additional stress of all of that which in itself suppresses our own natural immunity which is still a wonderful way to stay well. Another way to stay well is to make better food choices to reduce inflammation in the body which leads to many types of diseases. Minimize added sugars, processed food, cutting back on red meat, limiting saturated fat, and getting regular exercise go a long way to reduce disease of all types especially heart and mind. What small choice can you make today to have a lasting impact? I am having protein smoothies with blueberries at least twice a week instead of my usual skipping breakfast except for my needed coffee. Nothing changes if we do not change so make those changes today if you want to age well and reduce risk of disease. See me for more ideas as to how to stay well if you have questions.

- view falls as controllable
 set goals for increasing activity
 make changes to reduce fall risks at home
- exercise to increase strength and balance

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

- anyone concerned about falls
 anyone who has fallen in the past
- anyone interested in improving balance, flexibility and strength
- anyone who has restricted activities because of falling concerns

INSTRUCTIONS ON HOW TO ACCESS OUR CROSSLAKE LUTHERAN ON-LINE DIRECTORY!

First time signing into the Online Directory or Mobile App?

- 1. Go to members.InstantChurchDirectory.com
- 2. Click on the Create Login button under: "First time signing in?"
- 3. Enter your email address and create a password. The password must be at least 8 characters long and contain at least two of the following special characters: capital letters, numbers or symbols.
- 4. Retype the password to confirm it and click **Request Login**.
- 5. Check your inbox for an email from service@instantchurchdirectory.com
- 6. To complete the sign-up process, you will need to verify your email address by clicking on the link sent to you in that email.
- 7. Once you confirm your email, you may sign in at **members.InstantChurchDirectory.com** Your email with the password you created will work on all the Instant Church Directory apps on any device.
- 8. Find your household on the scrolling bar on the left of your screen and proceed to update your information and upload a family photo of your choice! Submit edits when done.

SECURITY FACTS



You're worried about security and privacy, and so are we.

Your account is protected by a username and password that only you should know. Search engines do not crawl any of the directory data located within the password-protected portion. We take your privacy and your church members' privacy very seriously.



Member Information Security.

Even though your data is stored with us, we at *Instant Church Directory* do not access your members' data, except for specific troubleshooting purposes within the directory. All data provided by members is held securely and we do not use member information such as phone numbers or emails for marketing purposes (either internally or by selling the information to other organizations).



We have a fully secure system for the online access just like the mobile app. Only members who are entered in the directory can login to the website, and once that member is removed they no longer have access. You can also make members inactive if they do not want their information to be shown on the online directory or app.

Mobile App Security.

We built a fully secure system for all our mobile apps. Only active members you authorize can gain access to your directory, and access is revoked as soon as you change any member to inactive. If you prefer that your directory is not available via the app, simple disable the feature.
