It is so true, especially for this particular time. "God works in ways, we cannot see, God will make a way for me." I hope that you are experiencing this promise of God's faithfulness in your own life, as we are experiencing this promise

in the life of Crosslake Lutheran Church.

We continue to be so thankful for the new roof that will be possible this year. The work will begin on the roof this fall, when the weather is a bit cooler! Along with a new roof, some have wondered whether we are looking at the issue of solar panels on the roof. The council has decided to simply press pause on that issue for now, until we can have meetings again face to face to talk about it among the congregation. So, we haven't forgotten or said no, but instead look forward to coming back to the possibility of solar panels on the roof hopefully next year!

This month, God is also making a way for us to still have some special things happening in worship, including celebrating Camp Knutson Sunday on August 2. So many people from our congregation are involved in that ministry, and we are glad we can still have a time to celebrate and financially support all the campers and families who make that community so special! Also, we will even be able to receive some new members in August, so watch for our modified ways of doing that! We will also add lectors to our Outdoor worship, down below on the deck. Now that we have a good rhythm and physical distancing established for worship leadership, we can add lectors! As I write this, we are still awaiting the announcement from our schools about how learning will take place for students this fall. We hold in prayer everyone involved in that decision and its effects: families, students, teachers, school workers, bus drivers, and administrators. That decision will be good information for us as well, as we look toward fall plans for our church community. We are so blessed to have our Outdoor worship space, especially since we have a significant number in our congregation who are in the vulnerable age category. The Smart team will keep looking at all the factors involved, but please be aware that whenever indoor worship does become an option, the experience will be very different. We won't have the buzzing conversation and laughter of people talking everywhere (that warm hospitality at which our church is so good!). People will be entering church and walking directly to a spot in a pew (probably not your "regular" spot!) that's marked for physical distance. We won't be able to sing together, even though we will be wearing masks. Unfortunately, singing projects too many droplets even through masks. We won't be able to have a coffee fellowship time or any mingling afterwards. All the social parts of worship that we take for granted, just won't be there, yet! No handshakes, no hugs. I wonder if it will feel a bit austere? So when you compare that picture of a modified indoor worship with what we're doing for Outdoor worship now, Outdoor worship seems a little more natural! At our Outdoor worship, we can be more social because we have more distance; we can see our smiles and at least chat a little more naturally from our cars!

However, through it all, our song promises, "God will be our guide, walking closely by our side, with love and strength for each new day, God will make a way, God will make a way!" So, who knows what ways God will make possible into the future as we go along? We simply trust and pray that God will guide us with each step of the way! Thank you for your prayers, flexibility, and patience as together we seek to be a community that keeps one another safe and well for the sake of the world! We also continue to be grateful for your generous giving as Christ's mission through Crosslake Lutheran remains vibrant and strong!

LAKES AREA MUSICAL FESTIVAL

Lakes Area Music Festival continues its 2020 season with concerts via Facebook Live on August 5, 6, and 7 at 7:30 p.m. and August 8 at 2 p.m. The midweek offering, *Imagining America*, will feature the "Nonet for strings, winds, and piano" by British composer Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, a descendent of American enslaved people. The evening will round out with Antonin Dvora's "Piano Quintet in A Major, Op. 81" with Van Cliburn and Tchaikovsky competition prize-winner, Kenny Bromberg. Friday, Aug. 6 kicks off the weekend with *City of Angels*, which includes well known cinematic works by the late Ennio Morricone, Philip Glass, and a string quintet by Erich Korngold, again featuring Kenny Bromberg. Praised by the New York Times for his "nobility and rich tone," GRAMMY® Award-winning bass-baritone, Dashon Burton leads the Aug. 7 concert, *Paradox of Praise*. After a mixed set of German lieder and songs by the great American composers Florence Price and Margaret Bonds, the program features Mendelssohn's Lutheran-flavored second trio for piano and strings, featuring Queen Elizabeth Competition prizewinner, Henry Kramer, piano.
