

I write this article in the "in-between time." It is the time after the call committee and council forwarded my name to the congregation as

The call committee, council, many of you, myself, and my family have been in prayer that God will do what God always does...provide a future. Thanks be to God.



Join us for a two-part Bible Study on the Fred Rogers Documentary, entitled: "Won't You Be My Neighbor?"

Charmingly soft-spoken and yet powerfully incisive expressing his profound ideals, Fred Rogers was a unique presence on television for generations. Through interviews of his family and colleagues, the life of this wouldbe pastor is explored as a man who found a more important calling to provide an oasis for children in a video sea of violent bombardment. That proved to be his landmark series, Mister Rogers' Neighborhood (1968), a show that could gently delve into important subjects no other children's show would have dared for that time. In doing so, Rogers experienced a career where his sweet-tempered idealism charmed and influenced the world whether it be scores of children on TV or recalcitrant authorities in government. However, that beloved personality also hid Rogers' deep self-doubts about himself and occasional misjudgments even as he proved a rock of understanding in times of tragedy for

a world that did not always comprehend a man of such noble character. -Kenneth Chisholm

We are also offering the option that the loved one can come along during that time and have a separate activity so that anyone who needs to have respite care can have it at the church. Thank you to Mary and John Knight for being a part of that process.

The **Memorial Day services** are well underway in terms of planning, thank you to the many folks who are offering their time and ideas. The planning team will meet again early May to finalize the details around both the indoor and outdoor service. The outdoor will again include the flyover

which Ted Silva has arranged for so many years (keep prayers going for good weather). We were able to confirm what I know will be a great keynote speaker. Dr. James Tuorila is an Army veteran having served during the Vietnam war and spent most of his 30-year clinical practice in working with veterans with PTSD as part of the St. Cloud VA system. One of the changes for the Outdoor service is to encourage early arrival prior to the 10:00am service. and donuts prior to the service starting at 9:30am, along with music. Please plan for enough time to get there so that you do not miss a minute of this very powerful and meaningful remembrance of those who gave the ultimate sacrifice. I hope that you took advantage of the **Senior Expo** — **Power of Aging** on April 27th. This expo was put on by a team of local leaders and area churches in order to highlight all the ways to age in place and with many choices. Thank you to all who volunteered their time to that day, I enjoyed presenting with Steve Kappas our local pharmacist as the many ways that taking medications safely can be a challenge. I hope that each of you carry a list of

medications in your wallet or on your smartphone. This could save your life if you were in a situation where you are unable to speak for yourself such as in a car accident. We are able to access medical records in the ER but it can create delays in treatment. It is also helpful to carry a list of your loved ones medications as well.

Put June 11th on your calendar if you are interested in the **Final Gift workshop**. We will repeat it twice a year. This 6-hour workshop looks at ways that we can prepare a book of final wishes for those we leave behind. The speakers include Rene Millner, attorney who reviews the legal part of that book; Pastor Kristin and Patricia, our Music director, on planning funerals; Kline Funeral Home will be here as well. The day ends with a look at advanced directives and hospice end-of-life care. This date will be open to community as well so I expect a full house, so register as soon as you see the sign-up.

Sharing God's Bounty

Keeping Our Eyes on the Prize

If a runner in a race takes his eyes off his goal for even a fleeting moment, he risks losing his focus and, along with that, the race. So it is with the Christian who must be diligent to keep his focus on his stewardship. If he takes his eyes off his heavenly goal and directs them toward his possessions, his worldly aspirations, or his temporal difficulties, he loses his focus and risks losing the race. The words of Paul

provide encouragement for us: "Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:13). Focusing on our Earthly circumstances can lead us in two directions... both of them deadly! We may either find things of the

world to be so attractive, they become the prize toward which we strain, or we find things to be so dismal that we despair.

Our Chief Steward, Jesus, our Savior, focused on the prize. We are exhorted to follow his example: "Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning

its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2). Talk about keeping focus!

"Consider him who endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart" (Hebrews 12:3). Talk about running a race! And he did it for us, "so that [we] will not grow weary and lose heart."

And look at the prize he won! He ascended

into Heaven and now sits "at the right hand of the throne of God." Heaven is our prize, too... a prize beyond compare. Christ's promise is this:

"Be faithful, even to the point of death, and I will give you the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10b).

Should we falter, as we are certain to do, we claim another of his promises: "The one

who calls you is faithful and he will do it" (1 Thessalonians 5:24).
