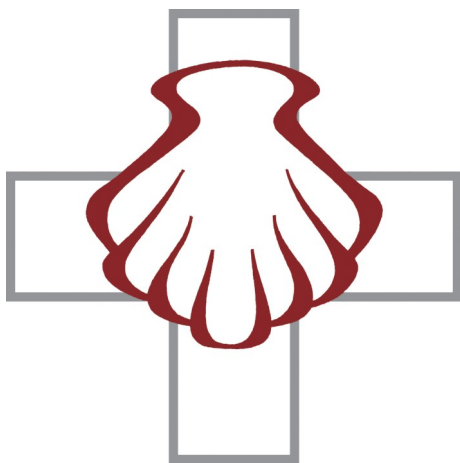

October Greetings!

In October, one of things we are going to focus on is baptism. At the end of the month, we when we celebrate the Reformation, we

will rejoice with our confirmands who will say “yes” to their baptismal promises. Leading up to that, several of our scriptures in worship will have a baptismal focus, and we will sing hymns focusing on baptism as well. As we continue to move forward in ministry, with things evolving, one of the things we realized was that rather than just having a baptism class for sixth graders and their care gives a few times in the fall, instead we could have a congregational wide focus on baptism for a longer time period. So, that’s what we’re going to do in October! ***I invite you to do some of your own research and dig out baptism pictures, certificates, candles, quilts, etc. that you have from your own baptism and research what month you were baptized in (if you can.) It could be fun to share that information with each other, and we might learn some new things about ourselves in the process!***

Sunday, October 6 and Wednesday, October 9 is the last of our three part series from the YES Gatherings – with the “S” which stands for Stewardship and Service. This is Commitment Sunday/Wednesday, when

you are invited to bring your pledge cards forward, as we live out our baptismal callings, stewarding (taking care) of all that God has given us. How might you be called to steward and serve as a part of Crosslake Lutheran? Please prayerfully consider this and respond, as a baptized and beloved child of God, freed in Christ to serve our neighbors! So, we’ll end with the beautiful prayer from our hymnal that’s one of Thanksgiving for Baptism:

We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you. Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

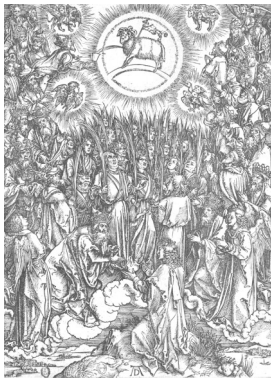

Bible Study

Our series continues in October.

Revelation and the Apocalypse



What image do you have of the word Apocalypse? Is it like the “end of days” captured in this artistic rendering? “The Apocalypse or book of Revelation is one of the most engaging and disputed books in the Bible.” This is Dr. Koester’s opening line. Does it pique your curiosity? Have you always wanted to explore Revelation but have gotten lost in the imagery of beasts, horsemen, and dragons? Have you wondered how God could be working in this text with our cultural assumptions of the word Apocalypse? Are we supposed to read Revelation as a coded message to be unraveled? If it is a message to seven communities in Asia Minor two thousand years ago, then what do we do with it today? Revelation has birthed beautiful music like “Holy, Holy, Holy” proclaiming God as sovereign of all. It also produced texts like “The Left Behind series” that leave you wondering whether God is good and loving. We will touch on many of these areas in our 6-week study of Revelation. We will look at the background of the apocalypse, look into the book itself and what it says, and conclude with exploring what people have done with this text. Here is roughly what you can expect. Bring your curiosity and join us on Wednesdays from 10:00-11:30.

October 9th Suspended Judgment & New Creation and New Jerusalem

October 16th Revelation and music & Interpretations over the years

GROWING KIDS A reminder that GROWing Kids will not meet on Wednesday, October 16. Confirmation, Dinner, Worship and Junior & Senior High Youth Ministry are also cancelled because of the school Fall break.

It's that time again—Flu season is just around the corner and for those of you heading south or west, we will be having a **flu shot clinic again on October 22nd from 12:30-4:30pm**. Our vendor will be MVNA as in the past and we will be giving the high dose vaccine which is recommended for those over 65. If there is enough interest, we will also offer tetanus/pertussis/diphtheria as well. Sign up sheets are available so that you can pick the time that is convenient for you. If you have not been to one of Crosslake Lutheran clinics, it is very convenient since insurance is billed, you get cookies and there is less than 10 minute wait from door to vaccine. Good handwashing is still one of the best ways to prevent the flu and should be done no matter what season we are in.

Thank you to all who made this past month's **Heart and Soul a success**. With more than 65 women attending, including many from the community, it provided an evening of fun, laughter and information. (We even had a few guys sneak in to hear Dr. Fenstad). A special thanks to Helen Silva, Ann Shirey, Laurie Ridgely, and Paulette Wilske who were gracious hostesses for the evening. Dr. Fenstad's presentation is available on disk to be watched at church for those of you who missed it. I spoke about memories – how they are formed, what gets in the way and what things to remember and what is best forgotten. If there is enough interest, I will repeat that part of the night for anyone who missed it -including guys.

Our recent Befriender course was held with 4 participants. I always enjoy being a part of this course which focuses on intentional listening skills which are needed not only in lay ministry but in the world today. What if we listened to hear rather than to formulate our response and tried to find common understanding and truths? There will be a commissioning service on October 13 as we welcome new team members. If you or someone you know would benefit from a listening presence in your life, please see me for more information. As always, all information is confidential.



The Matter of Balance class is full and will continue into October. One of the key components of fall prevention is having flexible but strong joints and muscles. Consider trying the yoga class at the community center for ways to stay flexible to prevent injury. Talk to your medical provider if you feel that your balance and strength are not what they used to be so that they can do an assessment of your medical condition and assess for medication side effects. One common thing we hear in the cardiology clinic is folks that are lightheaded or unsteady when they first stand up. This could be related to a response to BP medications or vascular incompetence and your provider should be in the loop if this is happening to you.

Plans are underway for **All Saints Sunday** which is held the first Sunday in November and repeated the following Wednesday. During this service we remember those who have gone to their heavenly home this past year. Letters will go out in October requesting photos from families of members who have passed away to be included in the service and a special invitation for family to attend. It is a time to remember that our time on earth is finite and that it is a wonderful gift to families to prepare end of life plans. If there is enough interest, we will host another Final Gift workshop before the end of the year.

Getting ready for winter often involves ladders—consider hiring someone to do the windows, cleaning out the gutters, etc. It is way cheaper than recovering from a major fall. It is also a great time to have that hard talk with family members who are on the edge of being safe in their homes over the winter. Sometimes all it takes is to remind them how few folks may be around to help and how nice it is to have company on those cold winter days in a communal living situation. See me if you need ideas as to how to start that conversation. Blessings—going outside and enjoy the few last days of warmth!

Sharing God's Bounty

Living for Jesus

German Theologian Martin Luther said, "If someone would knock on my heart and ask, 'Who lives here?' I would say, 'Martin Luther once lived here, but he has moved out and Jesus has moved in.'" In Galatians 2:20 the apostle Paul wrote that he, too, lived for Jesus. *"I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God."*

Who or what do you live for? If we live for ourselves and the things of the world, we will focus our attention and energy on amassing more and more things. It is easy for money and possessions to become overly important because our society tells us that more is better and that happiness and success can only be achieved by having the newest and best things. To find happiness and success, we work long and hard.

King Solomon, who was wealthy and wise, tried almost everything and found no satisfaction with things of the world. In Ecclesiastes, he tells us that he tried wine and women; he built houses, gardens, and parks; he bought slaves, herds and flocks, and amassed silver and gold. *"I denied myself nothing my eyes desired; I refused my heart no pleasure . . . Yet when I surveyed all that my hands had done and what I had toiled to achieve, everything was meaningless, a chasing after the wind; nothing was gained under the*

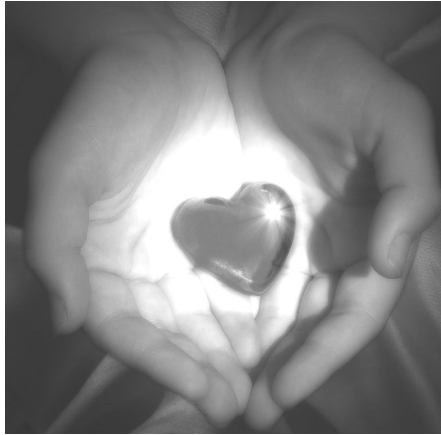
sun." (Ecclesiastes 2:10-11). Regarding money, Solomon wrote, *"Whoever loves money never has money enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with his income. This too is meaningless"* (vs. 5:10).

In closing the book of Ecclesiastes, Solomon wrote, *"Now all has been heard; here is the conclusion of the matter: Fear God and keep*

his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man. For God will bring every deed into judgment. . . Ecclesiastes 12:13-14). The only thing that finally gave Solomon's life purpose was living for God. Likewise, we as Christians understand that Jesus is the only person who can give us lasting peace, comfort, and security. He alone

meets our needs. Jesus' tremendous sacrifice showed us his love for us and his love compels us to love him and live for him. Filled with Jesus' presence in our lives, we are empowered to overcome the pull of the world.

Christian Stewards do not dedicate their time, their talent, or their treasure so that they may become God's, but because they are God's.
